This is done about every four years to determine the length of time necessary for the removal of injured bodies from the accident site, and get them patched up in the hospital. This day provides practice for the first aid and ambulance people as well as the hospital staff. That morning, the grade twelve class (who are already the biggest disaster in Elk Point**) were the victims prepared for the day's events. 

Good luck to the Grade Nine players going on to High School teams and to the returning and new potential players--See you on the courts next year!!!













Senior High Boys Volleyball
