Yearbook production can be a long, arduous and painstaking operation if carried out by a small staff of four. Each one must sacrifice a great deal more in terms of time, frustration, confusion, learning and other stresses that a larger staff might not have encountered. Nonetheless, upon completion of such a monumental task, there hopefully will be greater satisfaction and pride, shared by these few. Our production met with many unforseen difficulties. First, there were the problems of learning to use a new fully digital publishing approach. Then came the communication problems encountered with our printers. Later, we discovered, much too late, that our digital camera was somewhat inadequate in terms of its basic resolution and would not produce crisp, clear photos. The problem of pre-publication sales not reaching an expected goal also rasied concerns with final production costs and yearbook pricing. 
