

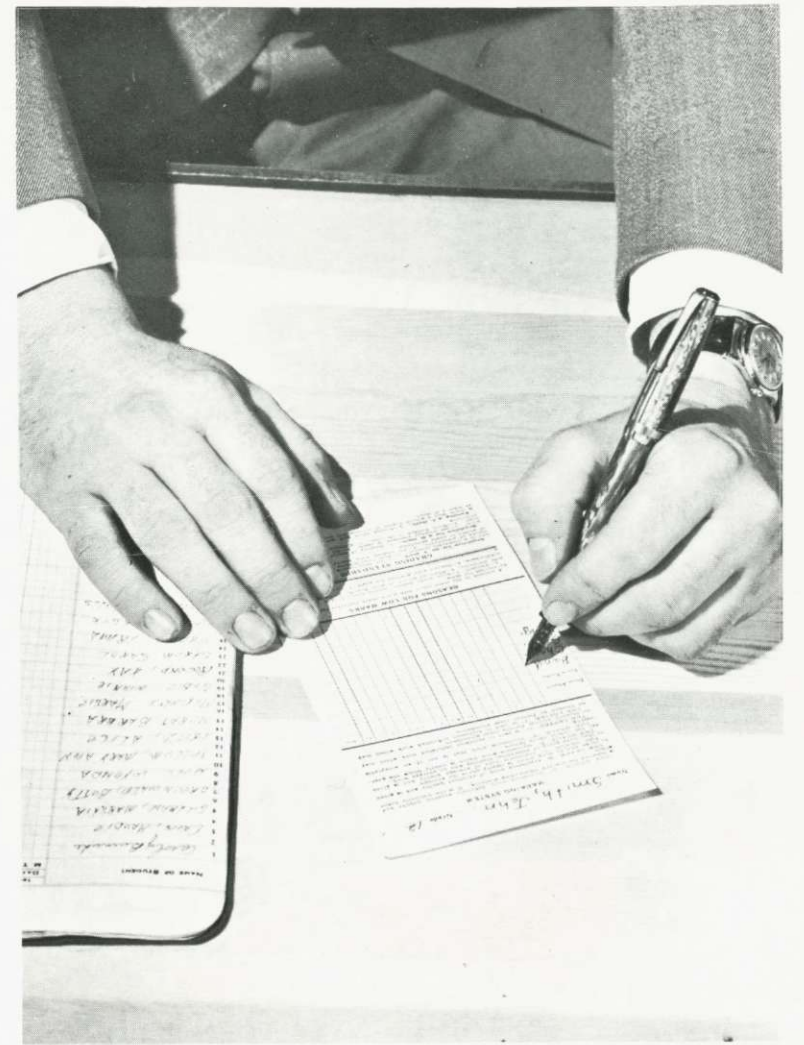

A sound general education will provide the foundation for the development of further skills, knowledge and advanced training.

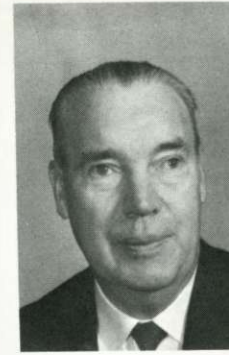
Adaptability, the ability to learn new ways, will be of paramount importance and increasingly necessary to permit adjustment to the impact of science on our changing society.

From our friends we have acquired much of our social experience and etiquette, such as it is.

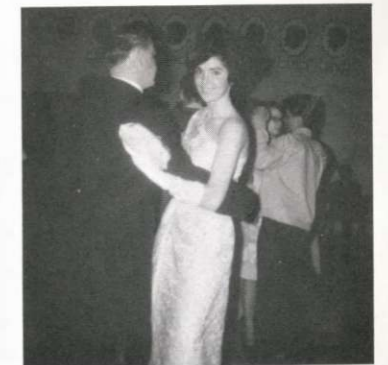
Our struggle to reach our present level has been long and often tedious. We have met with opposition and in turn have given opposition, especially to our parents. Indeed, the immediate future promises to be little different. We can only ask you, our parents, for continued patience and understanding as many of us will, undoubtedly remain stubborn, impatient, exasperating, and unpredictable in our search for we know not what. We must seek a fuller understanding of what we want from life, and how best to achieve it. Until this end is reached, and it will be, we will undoubtedly cause others to suffer. This we regret. If we alone, rather than our parents and friends, could bear every consequence of our actions, we would be that much better equipped to handle our own lives. Instead, we must learn through experience - often the hard way.

We live in a mad world; we lead a dog-eat-dog existence where the strong survive and the weak are swallowed up. How can any parents prepare the next generation for life in such turmoil? How are we, this next generation, such problems as we emerge from a sheltered life into the brutal force of the world?

But we recognize what we must face. We accept the challenge and the responsibilities, for we are young adults eager to guide our own destinies. Whether we find opportunity and success, or discouragement and disappointment, we shall have had the chance to live for ourselves. This is all we ask.
