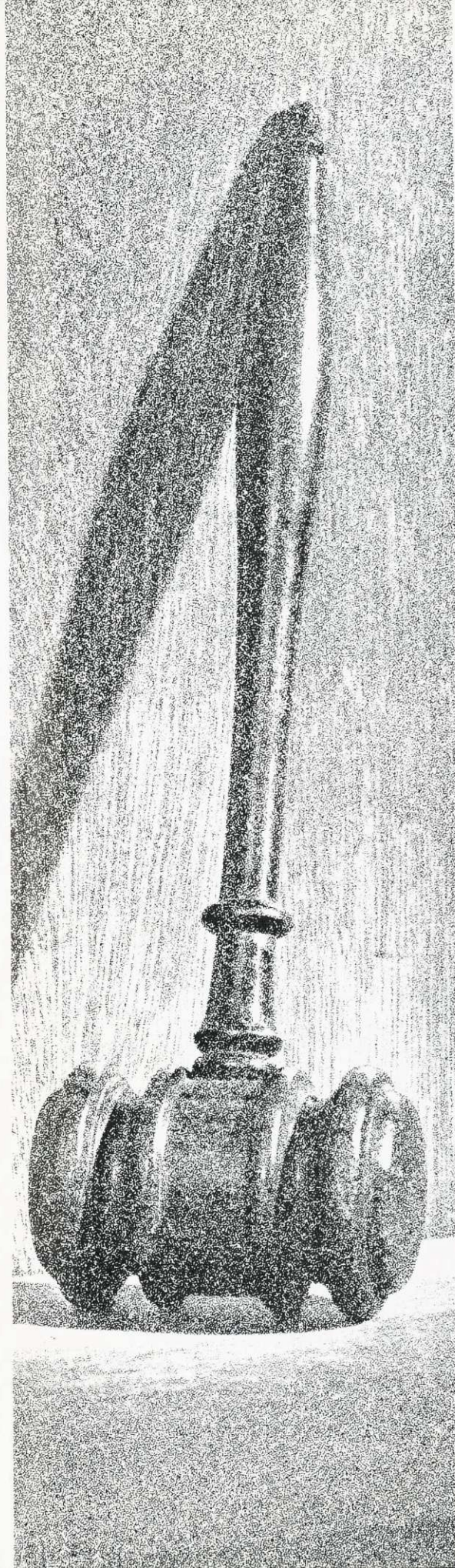


**MR. PAUL STEP**

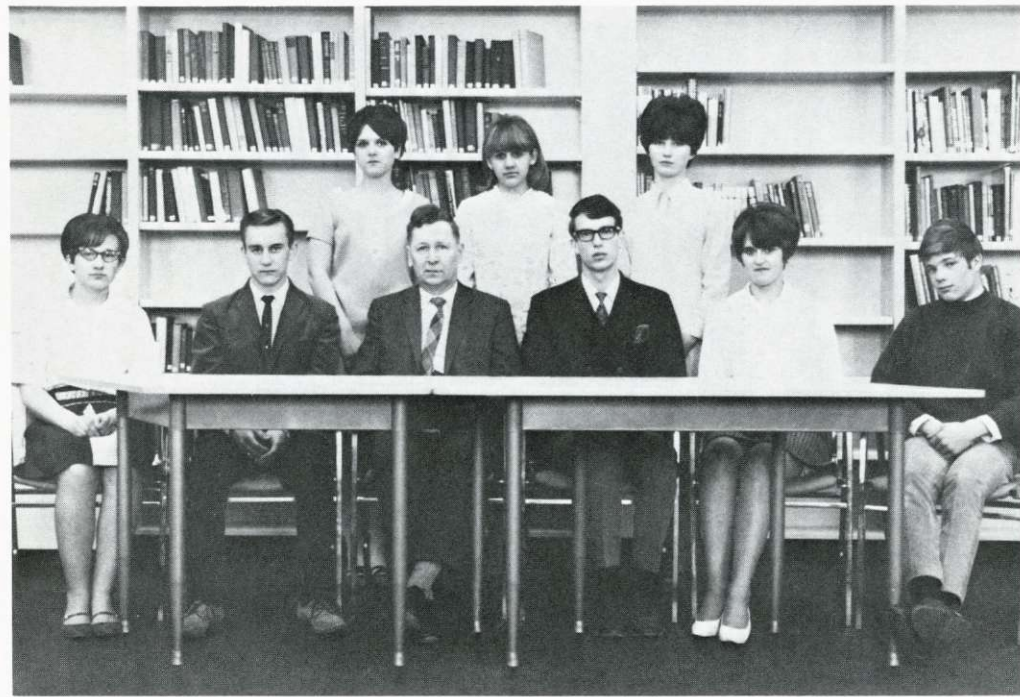
We extend best wishes to him and his family and hope that he will continue to serve our community for many more years.

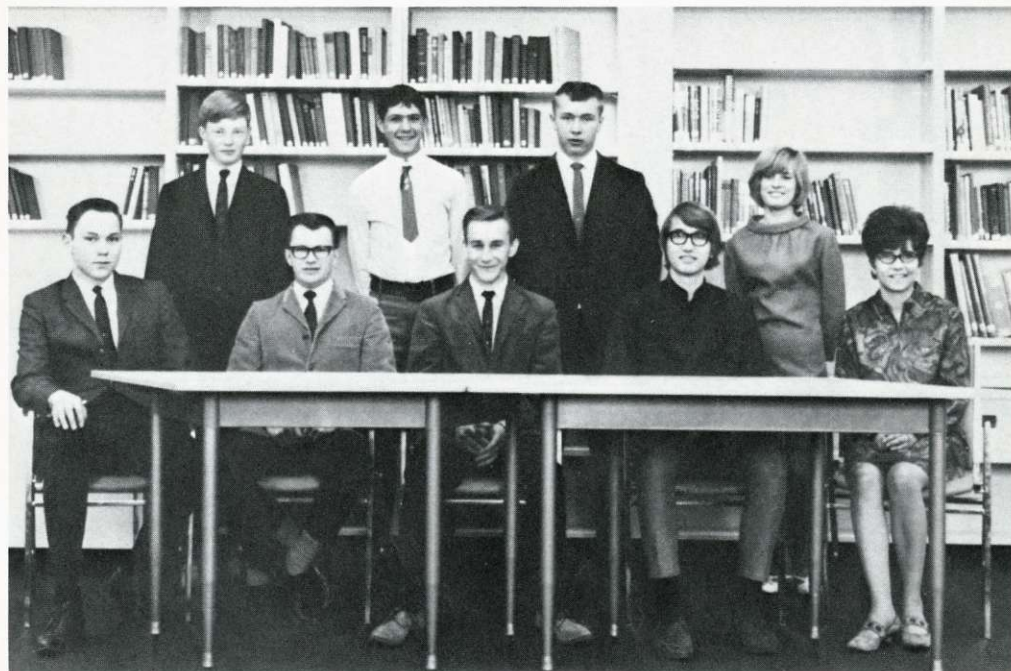

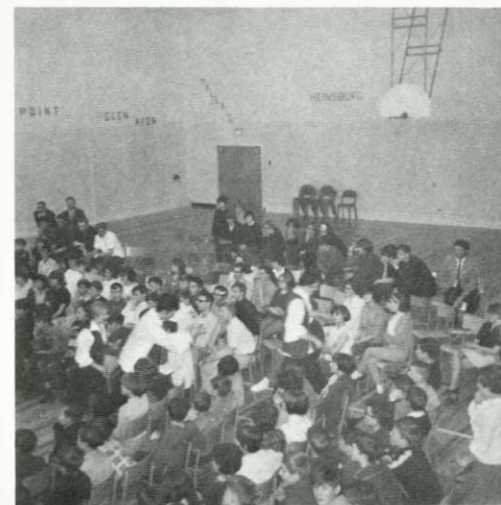

# ALLIED ARTS COMPANY



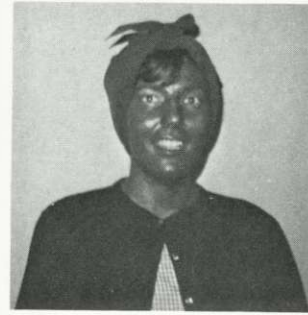

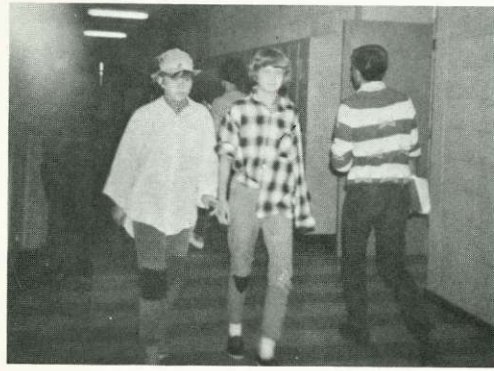
# "EVERYONE A STAR"

## SPORTS REVIEW

This year the athletes of the F. G. Miller High School have done an outstanding job representing their school. In the past year, I feel the staff-student co-operation reached a new height. The intramural sports program introduced this year was reasonably successful.

In the County Volleyball Tournament, held in St. Paul, the Senior Girls, coached by Mr. Boratyne, captured the County Cup and advanced to the zone play-offs held in Cold Lake. Unfortunately they lost both their matches. The Senior Boys, guided by Mr. Hellquist, lost in the finals to Glendon.

Basketball was again one of the major sports in our school. In Senior Basketball, both the boys, coached by Mr. Boratyne, and the girls, coached by Mr. Danyluk, finished first in league play and both went on to capture the County Cups. This was the first time the boys have been able to accomplish this. In the zones, held in Vermilion, the Senior Girls, for the second year in a row proved themselves the best team in Northeastern Alberta, and earned the right to represent the area in the Provincial Tournament. The boys lost the final game to Vermilion. In the Provincials, the girls won their first game but lost the second. In Junior Basketball, Elk Point hosted the tournament and both the boys, coached by Mr. Boratyne, and the girls, coached by Mr. Danyluk, came up with inspiring performances. The girls captured the cup and the boys narrowly missed.

The High School Hockey team participated in several exhibition games. The boys, because of their desire to play hockey, carried on despite the absence of a County Tournament.

The F. G. Miller High School Bonspiel was well supported with all the many curlers enjoying themselves. The rink representing the F. G. Miller High School in the zone bonspiel lost both their games to rinks from Grand Center.

This was the first year the F. G. Miller High School participated in badminton. The County play-offs were held here with players in single boys, girls doubles, mixed doubles from this school winning berths in the Zone Play-offs which were held in Vegreville.

In baseball, the first round of a modified double knockout was held in Glendon, where the Senior Boys won both their encounters and the Senior Girls losing their only match. Elk Point lost the second round of the Senior Tournament and the entire Junior Tournament. The Senior Girls won all their games to capture the County Cup but the Senior Boys, after winning another game, lost to Glendon in the final. The Junior Girls were defeated in the final game by Glen Avon and the Junior Boys also lost in the finals.

The athletes of the F. G. Miller School have again upheld the honor of our school. Thanks to all participants and spectators, as well as members of the staff who have helped the F. G. Miller sporting situation rise to the position it has attained this past year. This co-operation has made it a pleasure serving as Sports Director this past year.
