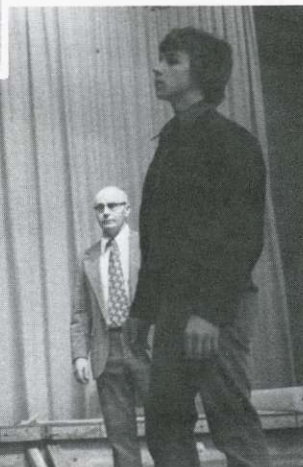
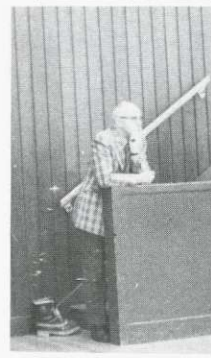


Dedication

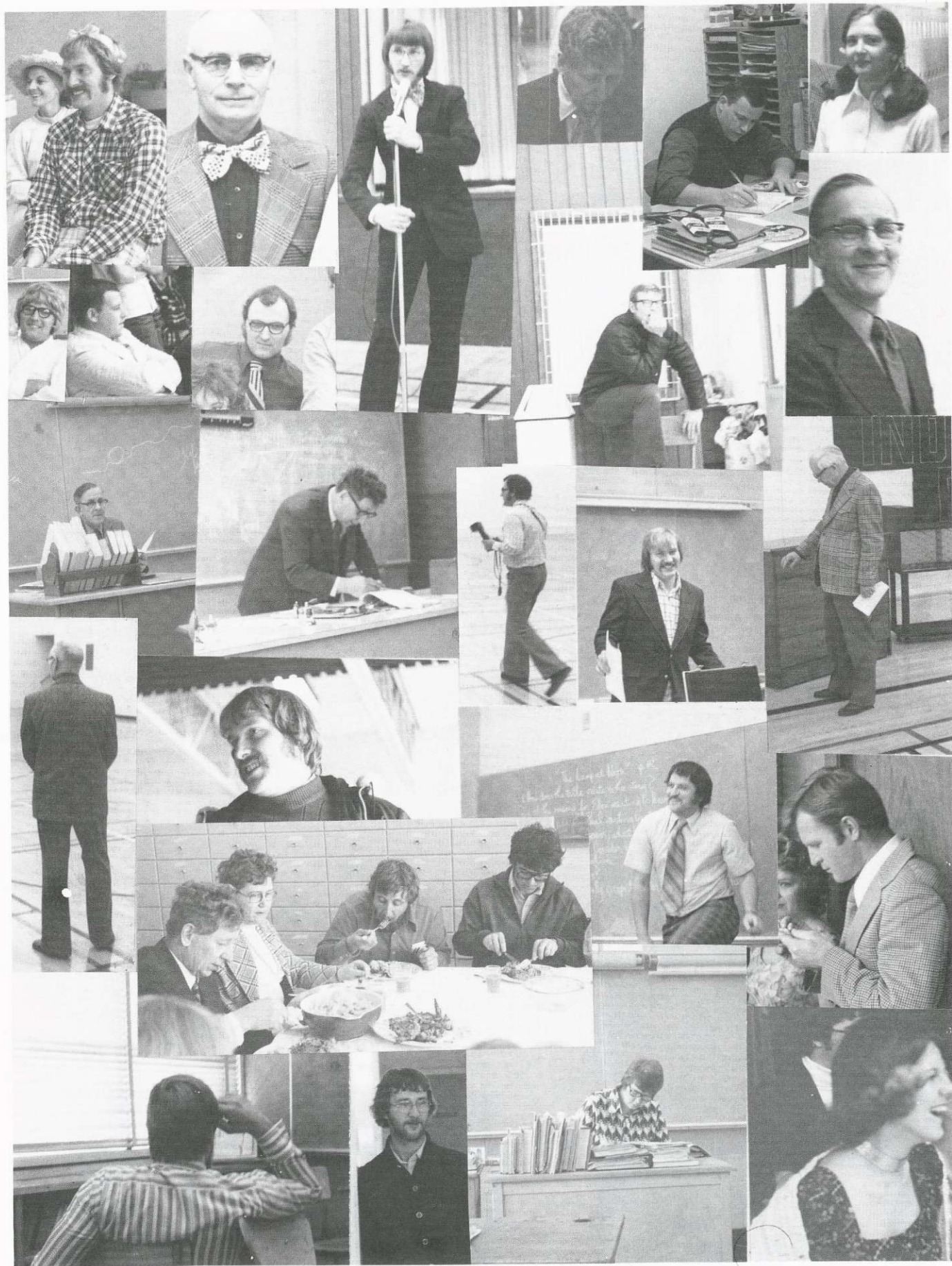


PRINCIPAL'S REMARKS

It is an interesting phenomenon in Alberta that adults are returning to structured learning situations in increasing numbers. This situation is referred to as Further Education and the aim of the Department of Advanced Education is to ultimately involve at least 1 out of 4 Alberta adults. The probable purpose of most of these students is to enhance the quality of their lives and to enjoy a sense of self-fulfillment. The value is a very personal thing but we have to expect that they find learning something new to be an attractive and appealing experience. One of the most exciting features is that we are as well revealing a new category of teacher in the old home town - the electrician, the welder, the bookkeeper, the housewife who possesses some special skill - who find that they can pass on their talents to others if the opportunity is available to them. Both instructor and student display initiative, a love of work, and a special sense of sharing and rapport.

Education in the broadest sense, of course, cannot end for you with graduation from High School; you will acquire further formal education by way of organized educational institutions or by your own initiative, and it is almost superfluous today to mention the necessity of adequate knowledge and training in the vocation of your choice. But you have both a right and a responsibility to become the best person you are capable of becoming, and this you can only accomplish by deliberately embracing the concept of lifelong study and learning; this will enable you to live significantly, and to approach nearer to the ideal of your maximum development in education and the Arts, and greatest personal growth in religious, moral and intellectual awareness. People fortunately are living longer, it is therefore even more imperative to learn how to preserve your own identity, to observe your own uniqueness, and still fit into the greater pattern of social life, - in a nutshell, to learn how to live your own life to the fullest.





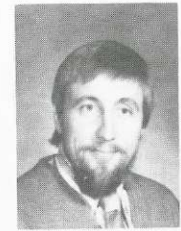

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

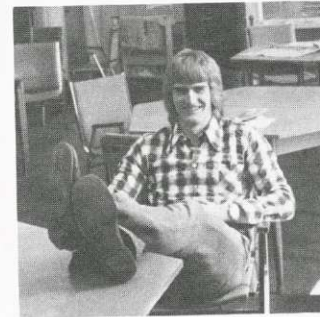
