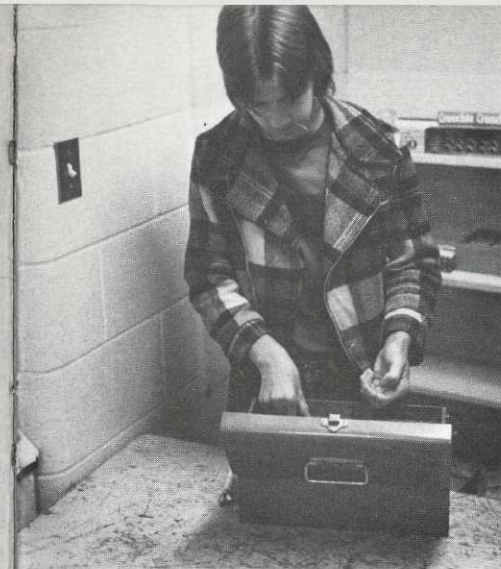


Dedication

To a greater degree, we appreciate the formidable task of raising a sound and responsible child in a world where countless influences make their mark on a young personality. We will indeed be forever grateful.

With sombre hearts, we face the task of saying farewell to old friends, perhaps in some cases never to be reunited. We will take with us all the wisdom and perception our teachers have provided us, all the determination and excellence of character our parents have given us, and all the strengths and pleasures our friends have shared with us. With these things behind us, we will face the confusion, insecurity, and responsibilities of a young adult in a changing world.

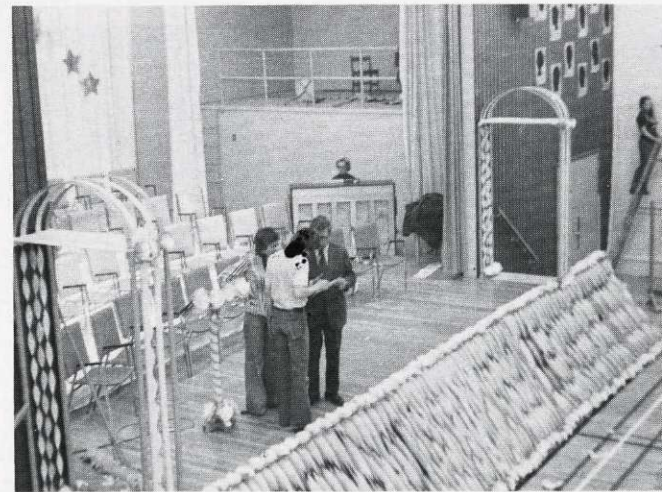
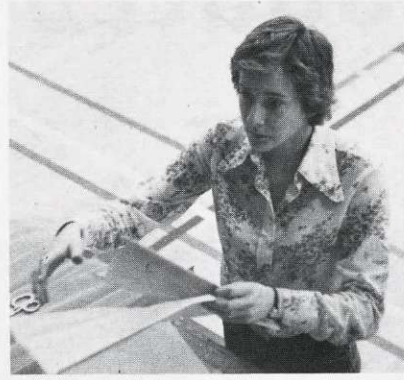
