



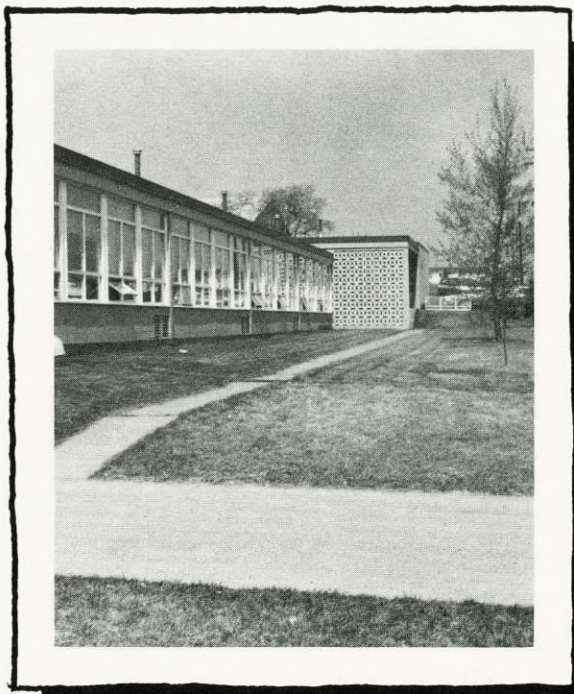

Dedication

This year it was unanimously decided by the yearbook staff that the 1980 yearbook should be dedicated to Mr. Harry Uniat. This decision was in view of his accomplishments in providing much time and guidance to the Students' Union. In addition to this he was not only an excellent teacher but a true friend to each and every student and teacher in this school.

Mr. Uniat was born in 1914 in Innisfree, Alberta. He attended the University of Alberta for one year before assuming a teaching position in Winsfield School near Rocky Mountain House, Alberta in 1940. His starting salary was a mere \$ 725 a year and did not receive his first paycheck until February. The following year he taught for a whole \$ 750. Following these two assignments he spent five years in the Armed Forces. He then finished his education at the University of Alberta and taught at Waslateneau, Pine Knoll and Speden before assuming his final position at Elk Point in 1959. Here he taught Math, Physics, Chemistry to grades 10,11 and 12. While in Elk Point he became extremely active in many community activities in addition to the Students' Union. His many accomplishments as teacher advisor include kitchen equipment for the arena, and the electronic score clock at the back of our own gym. His retirement in 1979 was truly a loss to the school thus we feel it very appropriate that Wapiti 1980 be dedicated to this dynamic man.

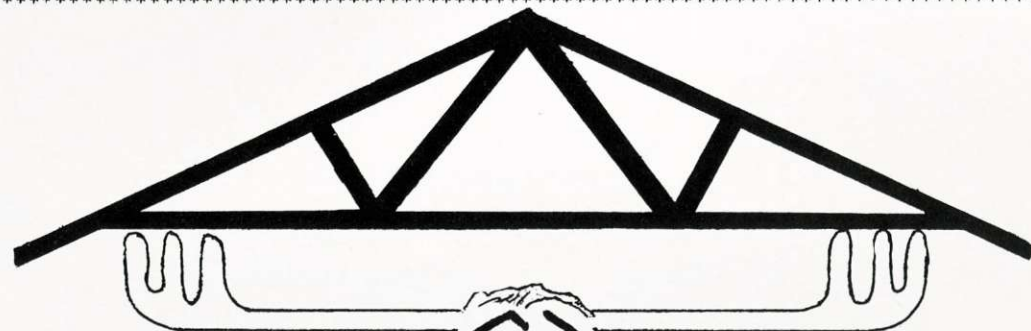

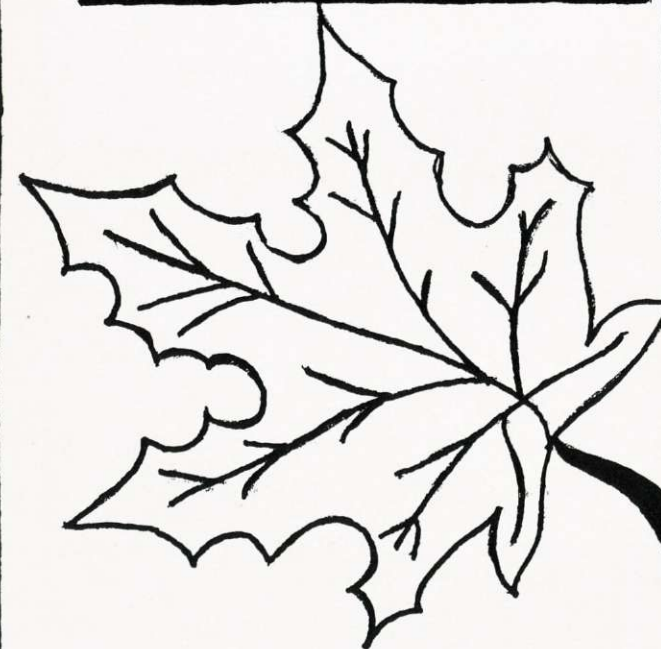

Here's the Story

The year was 1979-80 and this was the year that political musical chairs happened in Ottawa. Joe Clark led the Progressive Conservatives to minority government and Pierre Trudeau was put on the shelf. After eight months Joe was out and Pierre was back in.

The Alberta government earmarked \$75 million for celebrations of the province's 75th anniversary as a province. Saskatchewan celebrated its' 75th anniversary, too, but to the tune of \$6 million.

The F.G. Miller School continued to have crowded hallways but did receive two new teaching rooms which were built above the gym in the balcony. By the school year's end it was announced that final plan for further expansion to include two additional classrooms, a business education room and study hall-lunchroom were in the pre-tender stage. Completion date-probably, the spring of 1981.

The Russians invaded Afghanistan and many countries vowed to boycott the 1980 Moscow Olympics. Iranian students held Americans hostage and the US planted a flag-a-day to mark time passage. They also left helicopters and a number of soldiers in the Iranian desert in an attempt to free the hostages.

Biology high school students and Lawrence Pidluzny went on a field trip to California and Mexico. The trip was so good that another one was planned for the coming year.

The Minister of Education came to our school twice. Once in the fall for building inspection and in the spring to be the guest speaker at graduation.

The Special Education classes sold hot food at noon hour sales three times a week. They also went into a small printing business. 2M Resources was launched.

On some Fridays after school Junior high discos promoted by Ken Bucyk and Cheryl Tokariuk were a good idea, but attendance was **not** very good.

The Lakeland Theatre Society was formed and a number of productions were put up for public viewing and some students showed an obvious talent.

Miss Cheryl Tokariuk, Ron Craddock, and Dave Woloshyn joined the staff and by the year's end Miss C. Tokariuk, Ken Bucyk, Jan Srinivason and Klara Montalbetti resigned.

In the community people were touched by sad events, deaths, and personal pain. There were triumphs and victories, large and small.

The Bantam hockey team played in the provincial "C" championships, hosted in Elk Point, and although they didn't win, they showed well. The Midgets had a chance, but fizzled. The Ag. Society installation of artificial ice in the fall of '79 was a big plus.

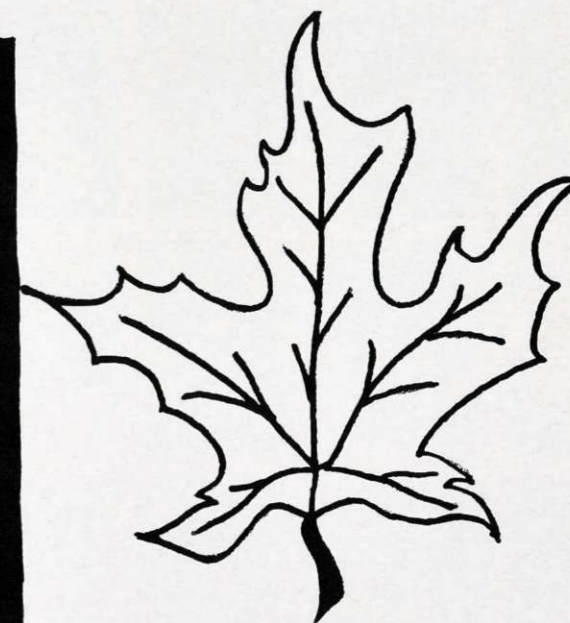
The Eskimos won the Grey Cup, the Islanders the Stanley Cup and the Pirates the World Series.

The Lake Placid Olympics saw new heights in athletic achievement. This may well have been the last full world participation in an Olympic games.

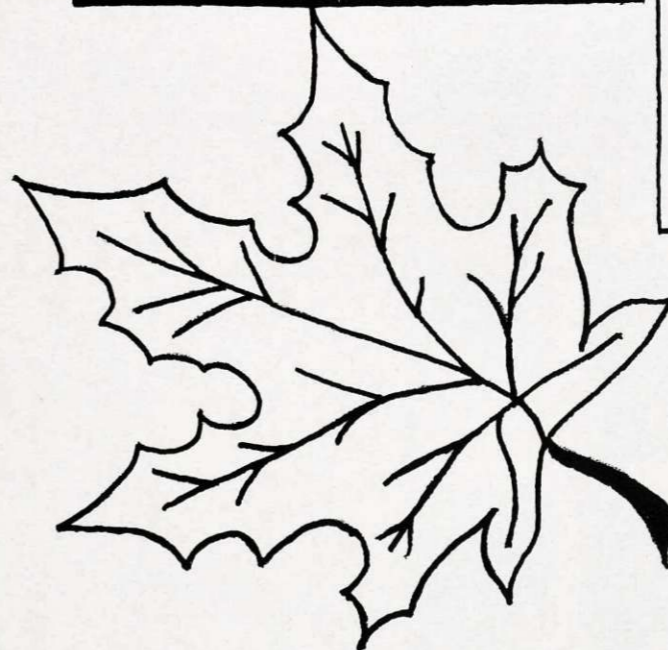

Ladies and Gentlemen, Honored Guests, Fellow Graduands

The theme we have chosen for our graduation this year, is "Yesterday's Dreams are Tomorrow's Realities." Whether we realize it or not, each member of this year's graduating class is presently living in a "transitional period". We have just closed the book on "Yesterday's Dreams," but have not yet entered into the world of "Tomorrow's Realities." We realize that the difference between these two worlds will be immense, but none of us know exactly what to expect from the future. President's Message

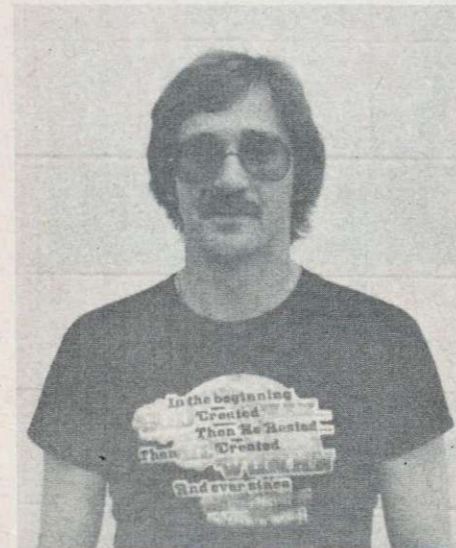
