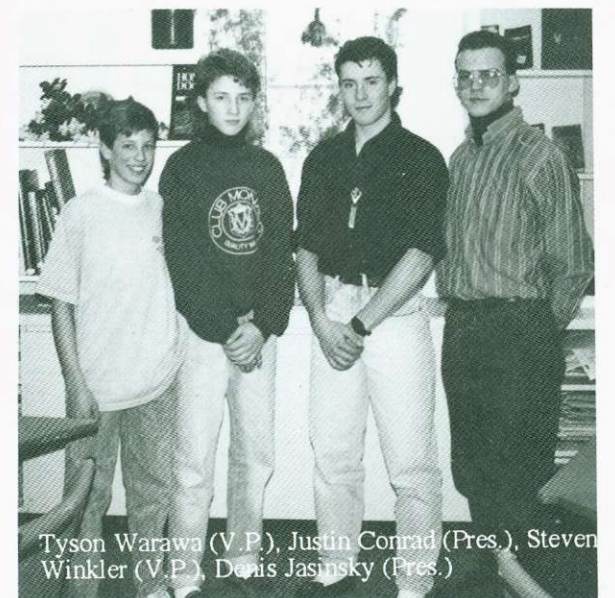

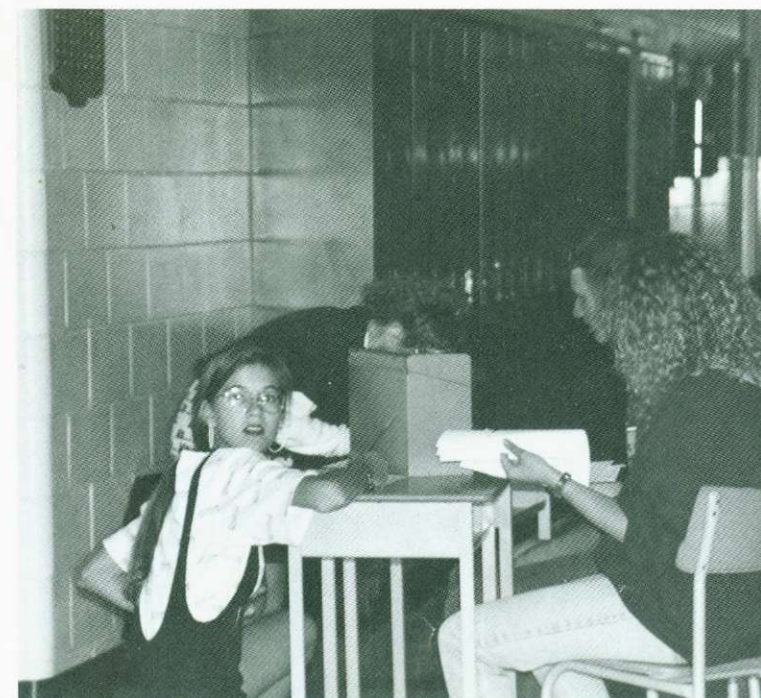

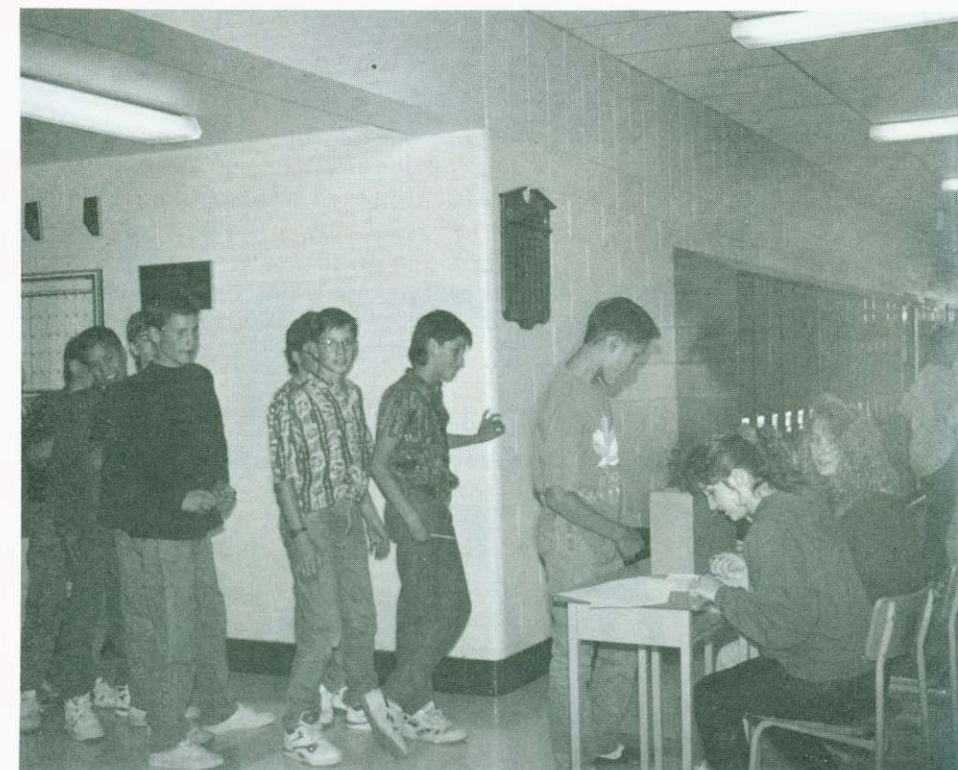
It also made my job as president of the student's union a very rewarding experience and I thank everyone for their support and confidence.

World Vision is a nonprofit organization that raises money to provide immediate food aid and establish community development projects in more than 90 countries around the world.

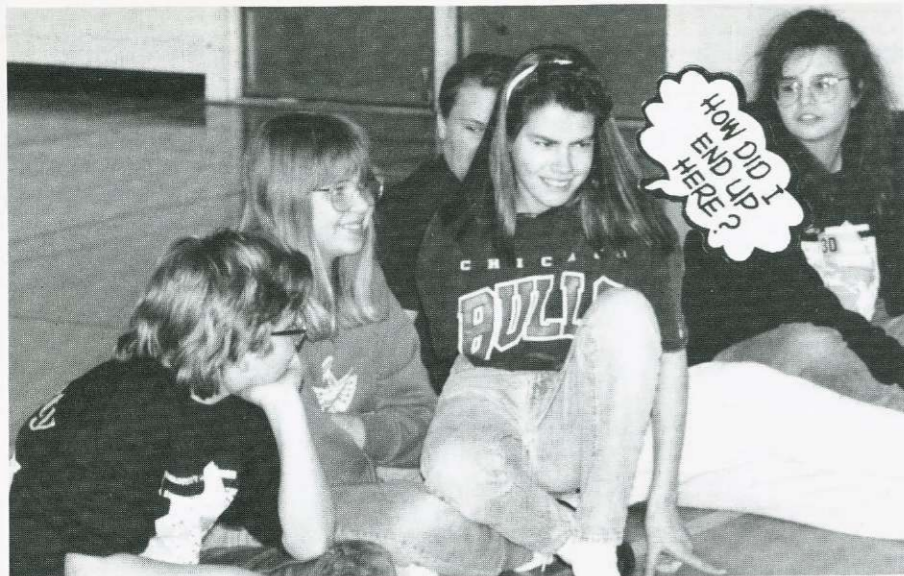

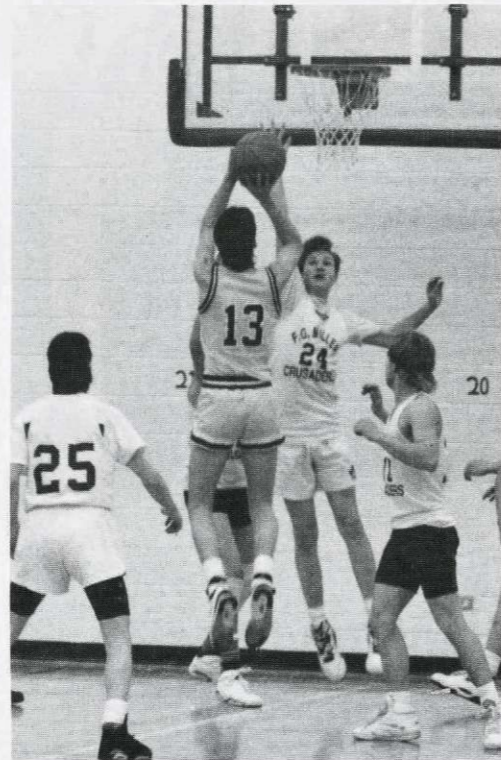
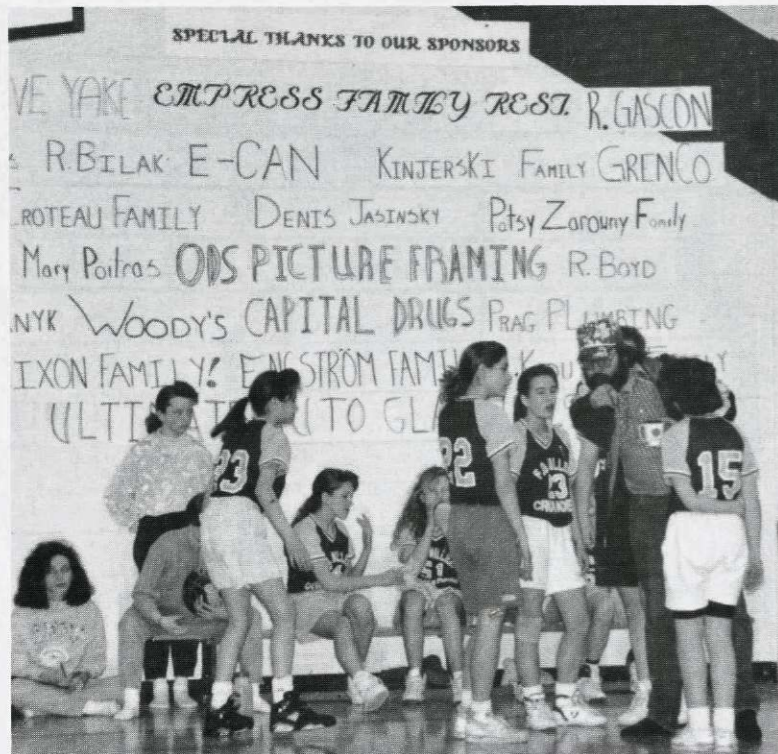
Other activities included having 2 representatives on students' council, a suggestion box, a peer support logo and t-shirt design, and selling Elks Van tickets (isn't that ironic!).

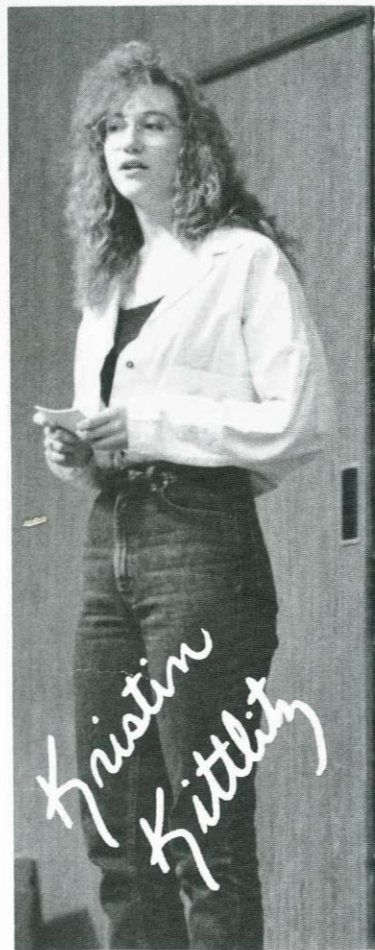
theme -- the re-occurring "IT" we finally chose. There were countless episodes of hilarious comedy as various staffers came up with their own spinoff ideas of this theme.
