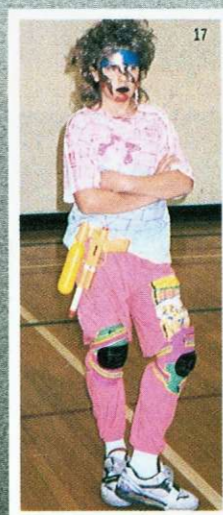
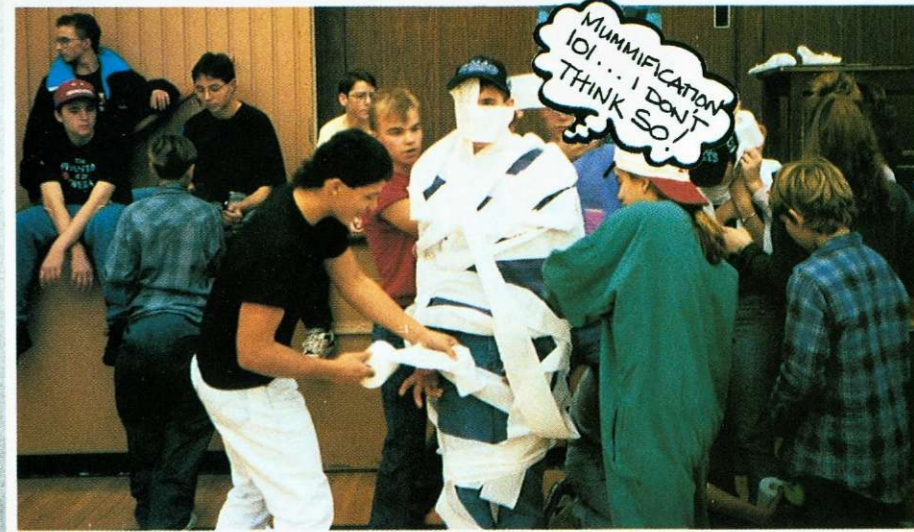
For intermediate girls, there were four runners: Tammy Zacharuk, Coleen Rupchan, Jaime Ballas, and Lindsay Liebrecht.

"Now," he said, "are there any questions?"

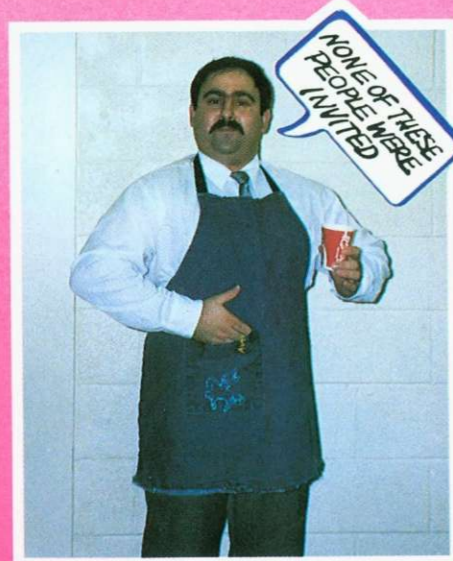
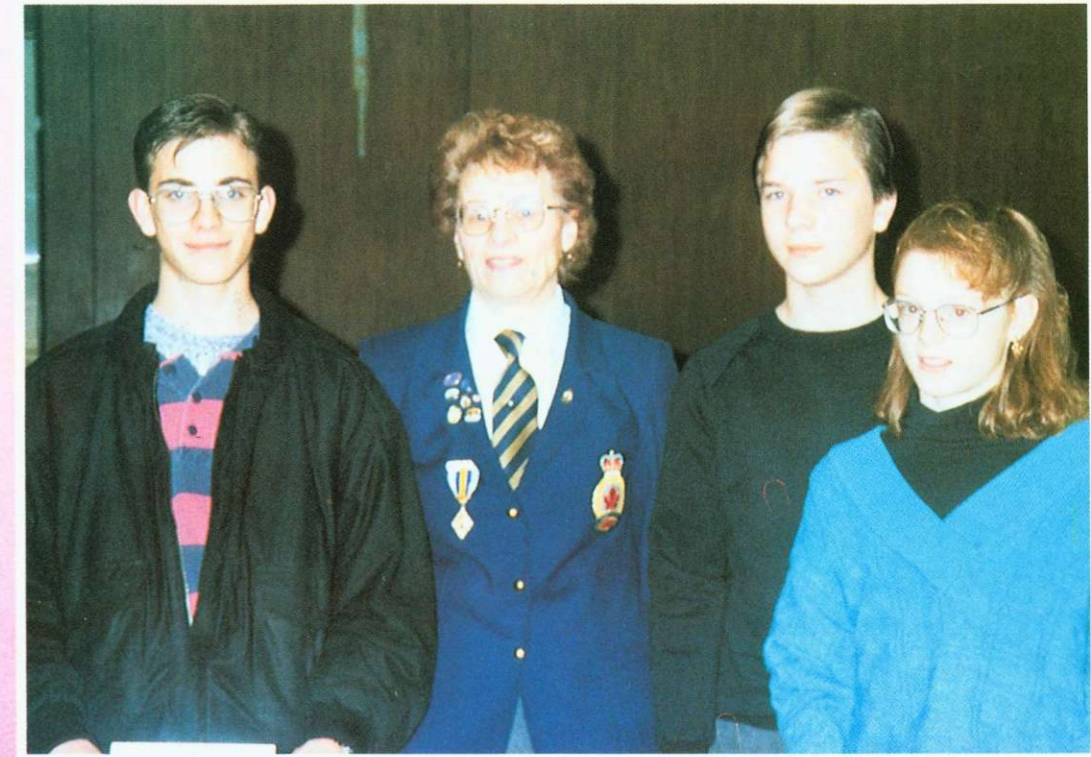
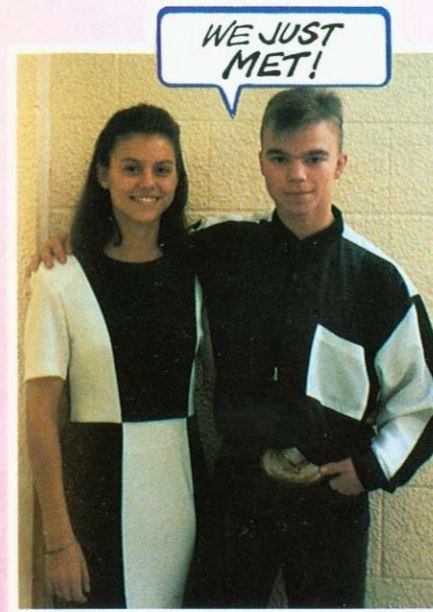

An ongoing tradition at our school is the Christmas Brunch, cooked for the students by their teachers on the last day of school before the holidays.

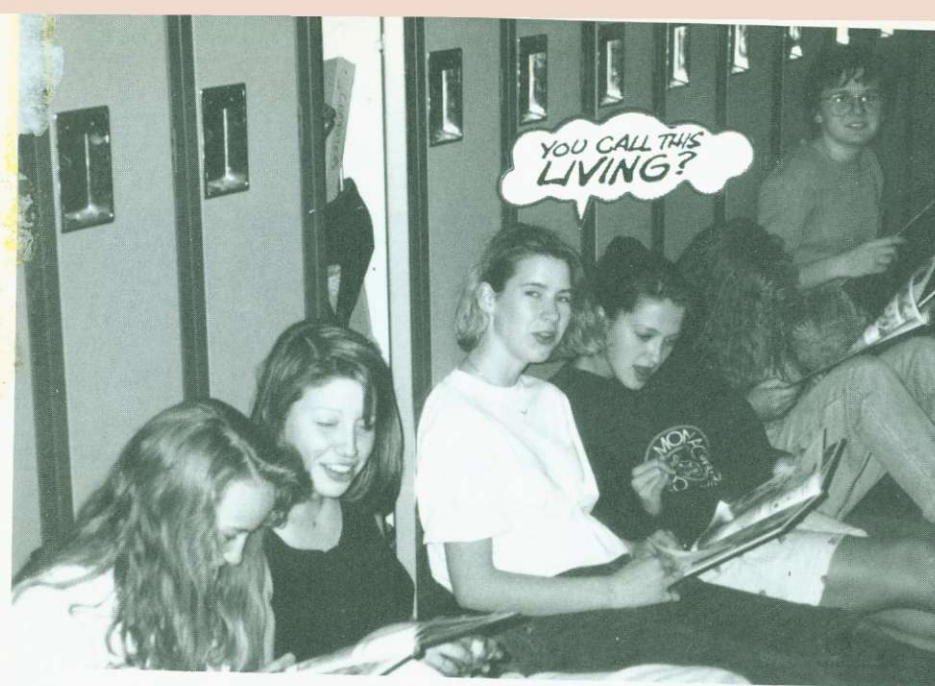

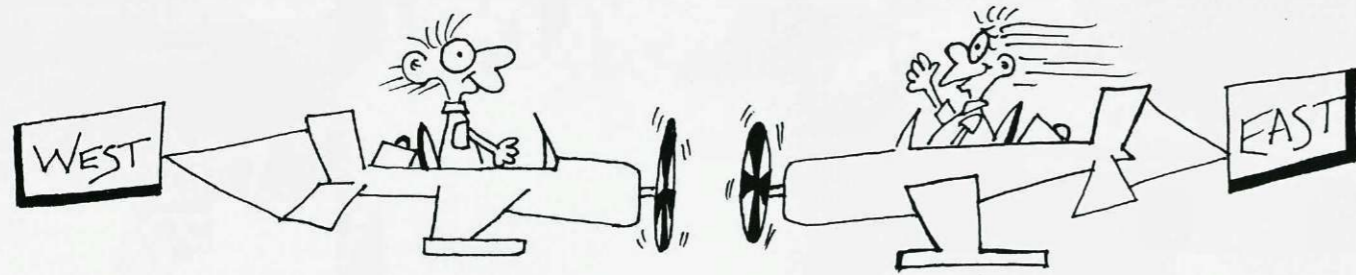
Science Fair was held March 23. **Kids** from grades 7-10 showed off their science expertise in the gym. The finalists were:

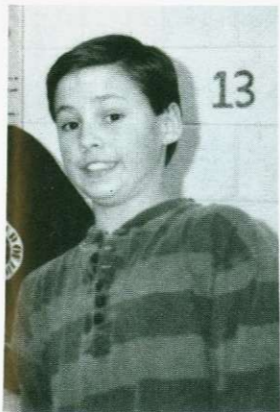
Editor's Message

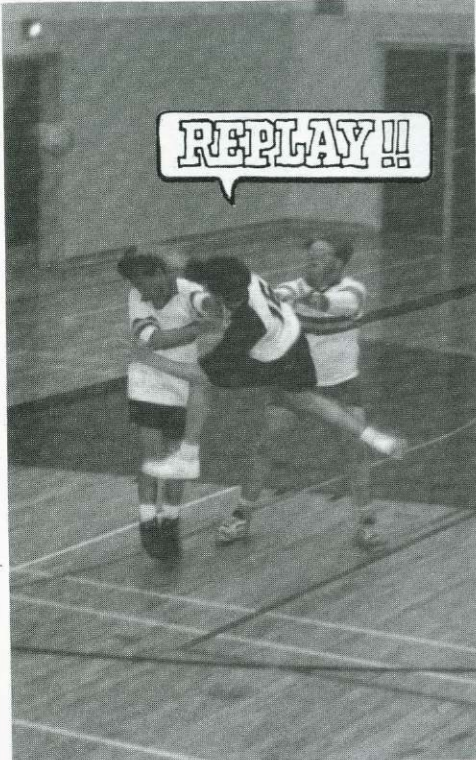

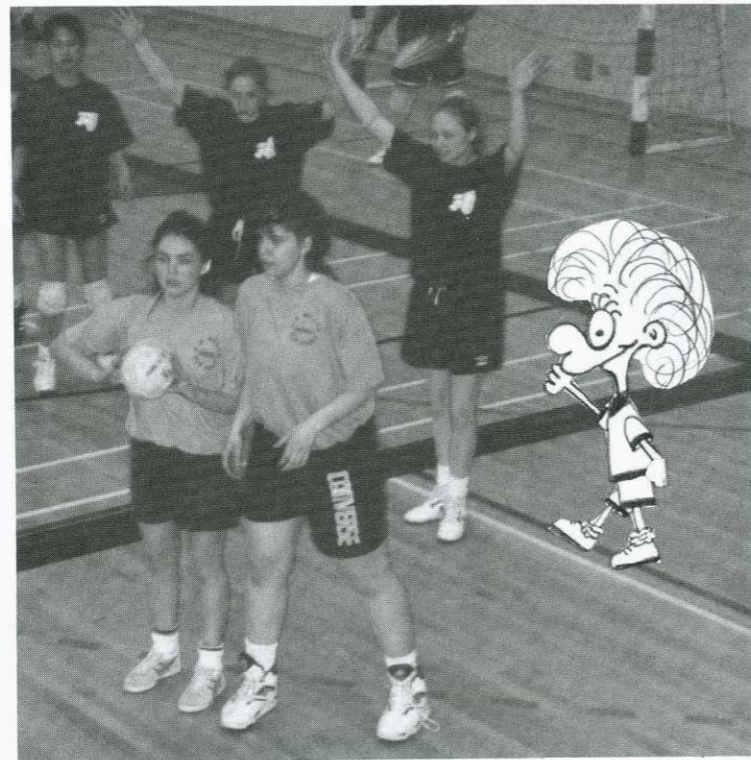

In April, the boys travelled to Fort McMurray where they placed third in the invitational tournament which featured the junior mens provincial team.

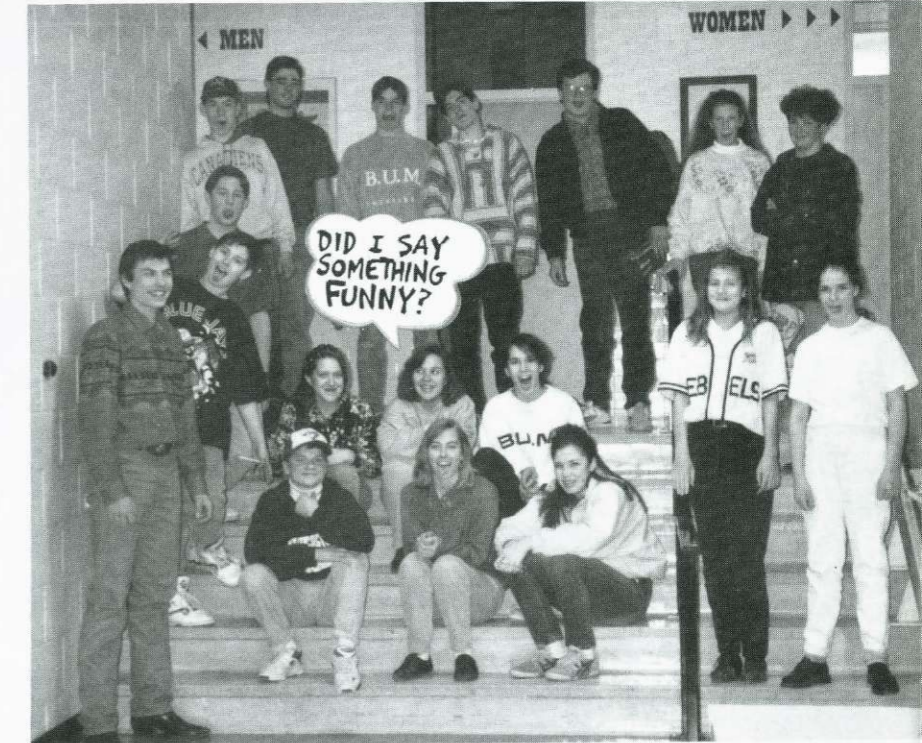
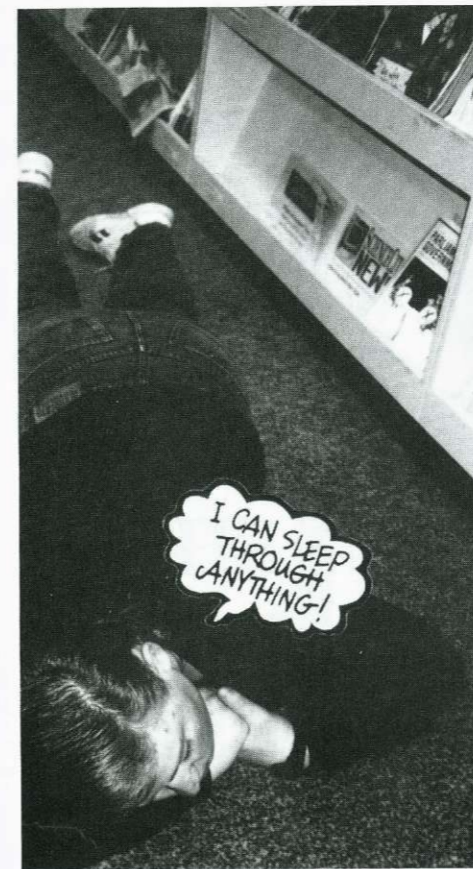
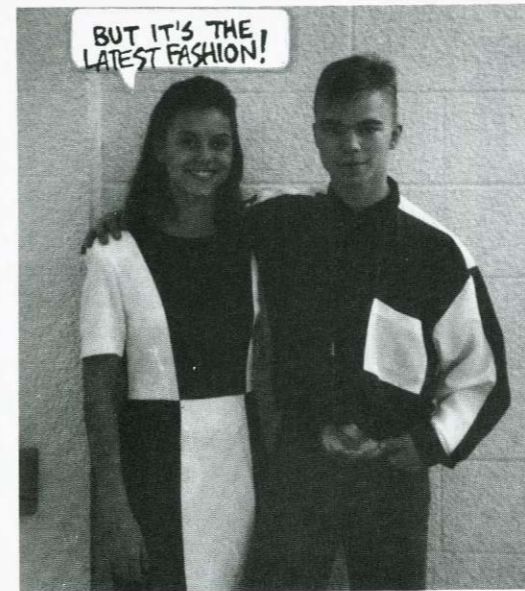
