It Could Happen TO YOU

On September 14, 1994, 33 Grade 10 CALM students attended the P.A.R.T.Y. (Prevent Alcohol and Risk Related Trauma In Youth) Program at the Misericordia Hospital in Edmonton. The group was given a tour of Emergency, Intensive Care and a Check Stop Unit.

At ICU and Emergency a staff member explained the typical pathway of a trauma patient and there was a mock simulation of a patient. An Edmonton City Police officer toured the students through the check stop unit, demonstrating equipment and allowing volunteers to blow into the breathalyzer unit.

The students watched videos/slides which showed vehicle collisions and listened to some presenters (Police, Rehabilitation Practitioner) who discussed their relevant experiences with victims.

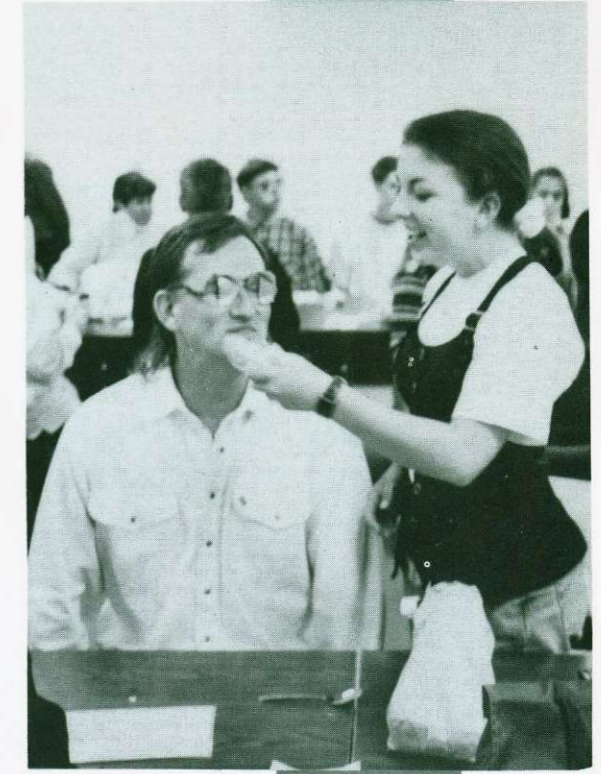
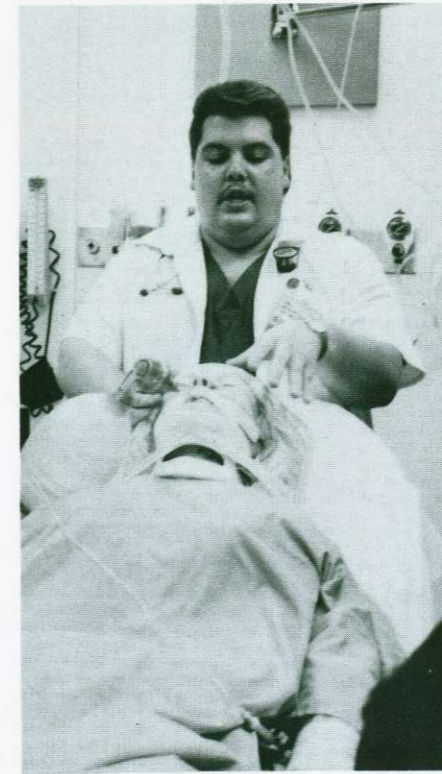
Dave, a paraplegic, spoke to the group on the incident that produced his injury and how his lifestyle has changed. He discussed the long hard road of rehabilitation and the affects this has had on him and his family life.

During lunch, each participant was given a disability and had to eat their lunch with it. This scenario gave everyone hands-on experience of living with a disability for a short period of time.

The presenter tried to expose the group to the reality and consequences of risk-taking behaviors and tried to provide students with positive alternatives and choices to these behaviors. Some options discussed: contract for life, friends for life card, designated drivers, buckle up, drive defensively, and looking out for friends.

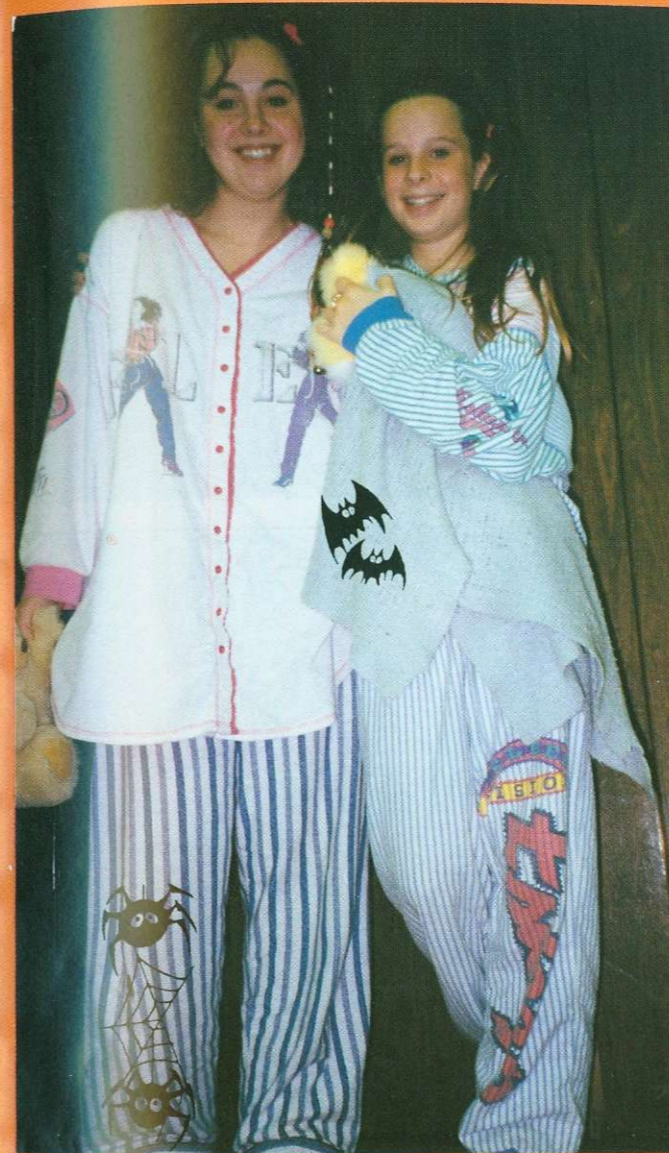
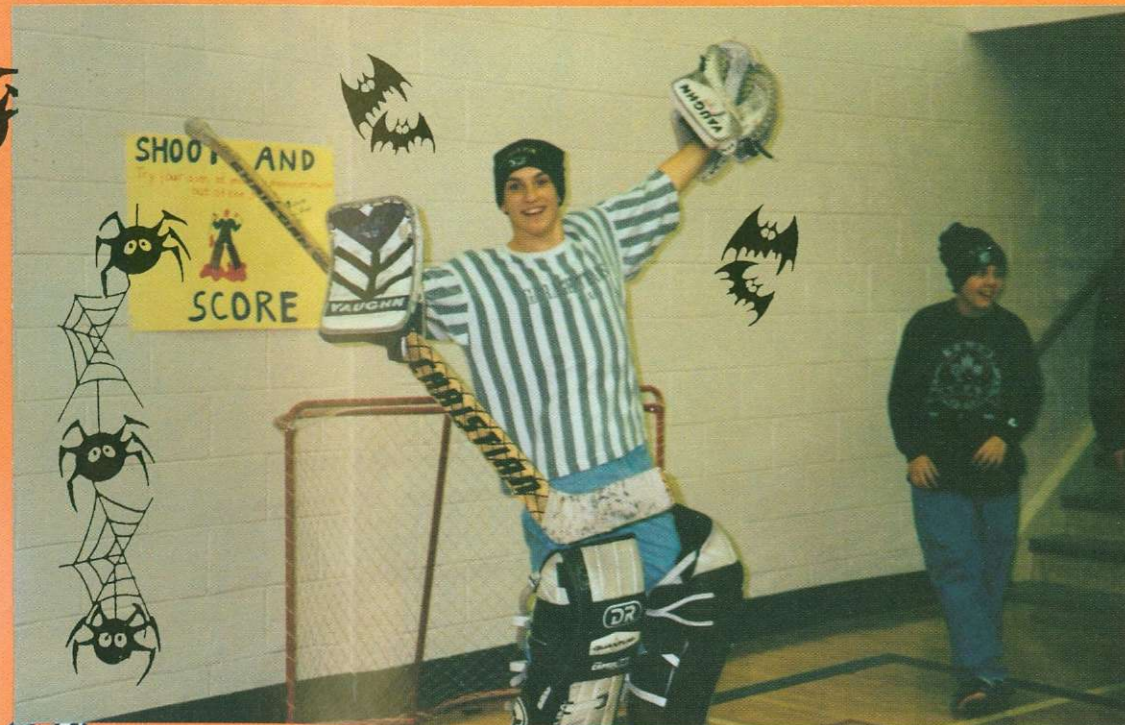


Tales from the Crypt

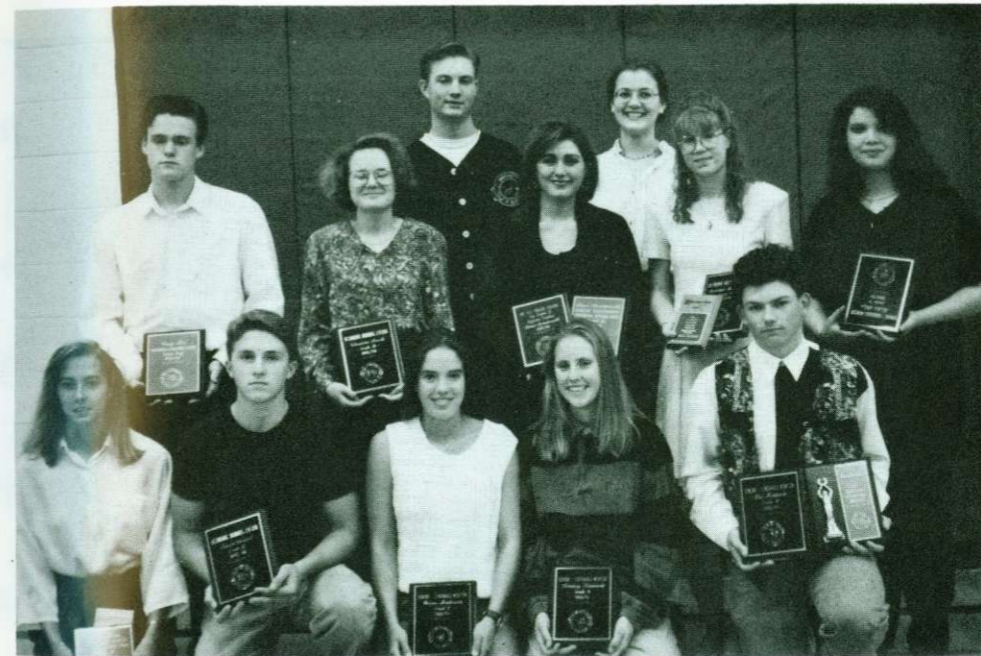

Crusaders Remember *The Longest Day*

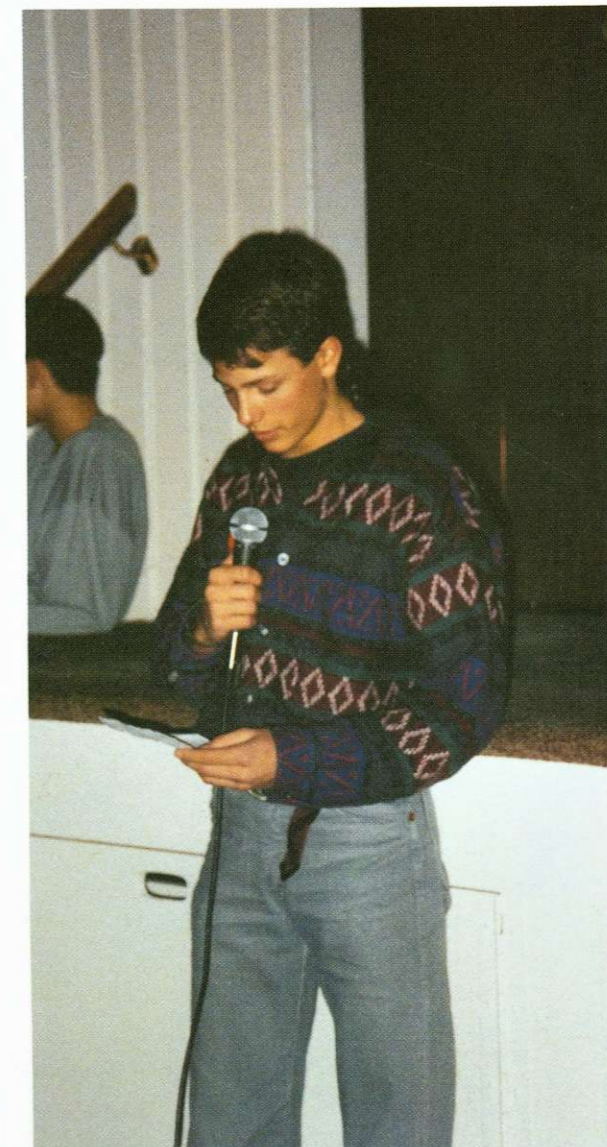


On November 10, 1994, the FGM Studios held a Remembrance Day ceremony.

"Who Dwn It?"

echoed through the halls from November 15 through 18, as Sherlock Smereka lead the Crusaders on a quest to solve Rigor Mortis in Row Six. This program, which deals with forensic science techniques, was brought to us by the Science Alberta Foundation. Prior to the actual case, a 40 minute presentation was given to all students from grade 6 through 12. Everyone got to take their own fingerprints and were given a few clues on what to look for

The program itself, which was greeted with enthusiasm and excitement, ran the entire week with each class spending 80 minutes amongst the seven stations: scene of the crime, handwriting analysis, documents, medical examiner's office, fingerprints, impressions, and ink analysis. The amateur detectives, with the help of volunteers, read out and role played the statements and had to decide which of the six suspects murdered seventeen year old Brad Larsen, and what their motive was. Everyone was eligible to win one of two games and one mystery book per class.

By the week's end, the tension was high. Who dwn it? Everyone found out the following Monday that it was Tony Hunt, Brad's stepfather (2/3 of the school was right). His motive was money and the means was poison in Brad's last prescription pill. With the case solved, book prizes were awarded to: Joey Farebrother, Kent Bjornstad, Denise de Moissac, Kylee Saranchuk, Greg Zarowny, Jeremy Johnson, Kandice Bjornstad, James Babenek, Kyle Bintz, and Heidi Kozicki. The game Clue was won by Dean Kozicki and How to Host a Murder was awarded to Tanya Pankiw from Grade 6.

Before closing the case forever, special thanks to all the parents and community volunteers who donated 136 hours to the program, 2M Resources, the Students' Union and R.E. Beattie Library for donating the prizes, the hospital for donating Resuscitation Annie (who played Brad in the bodybag) and the grade 7's who drew the two sets of caricatures of the suspects.

Later in the afternoon, the senior actors (Grades 11 and 12) had the opportunity to participate in several workshops sponsored by Generation 2000.

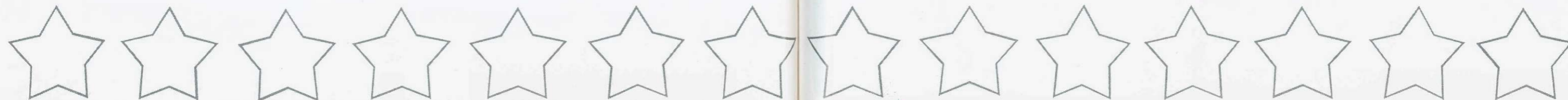
The actors had a great time and really learned a lot about themselves and how to take charge.

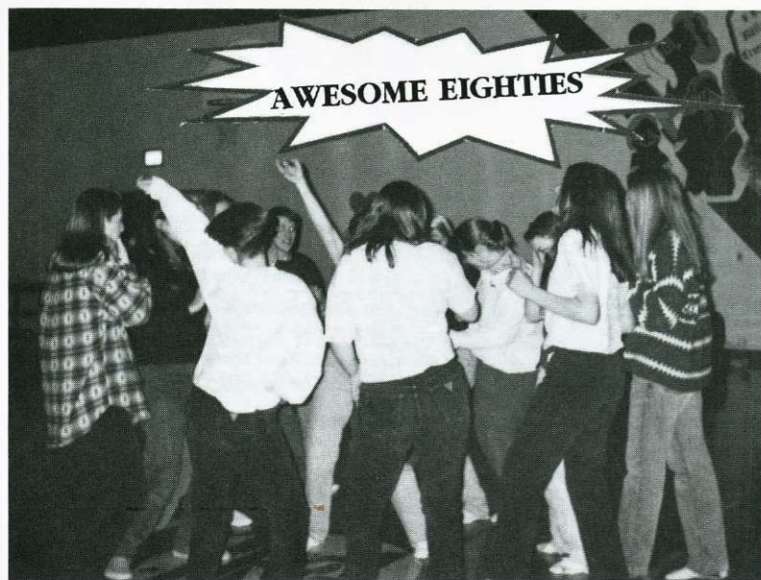

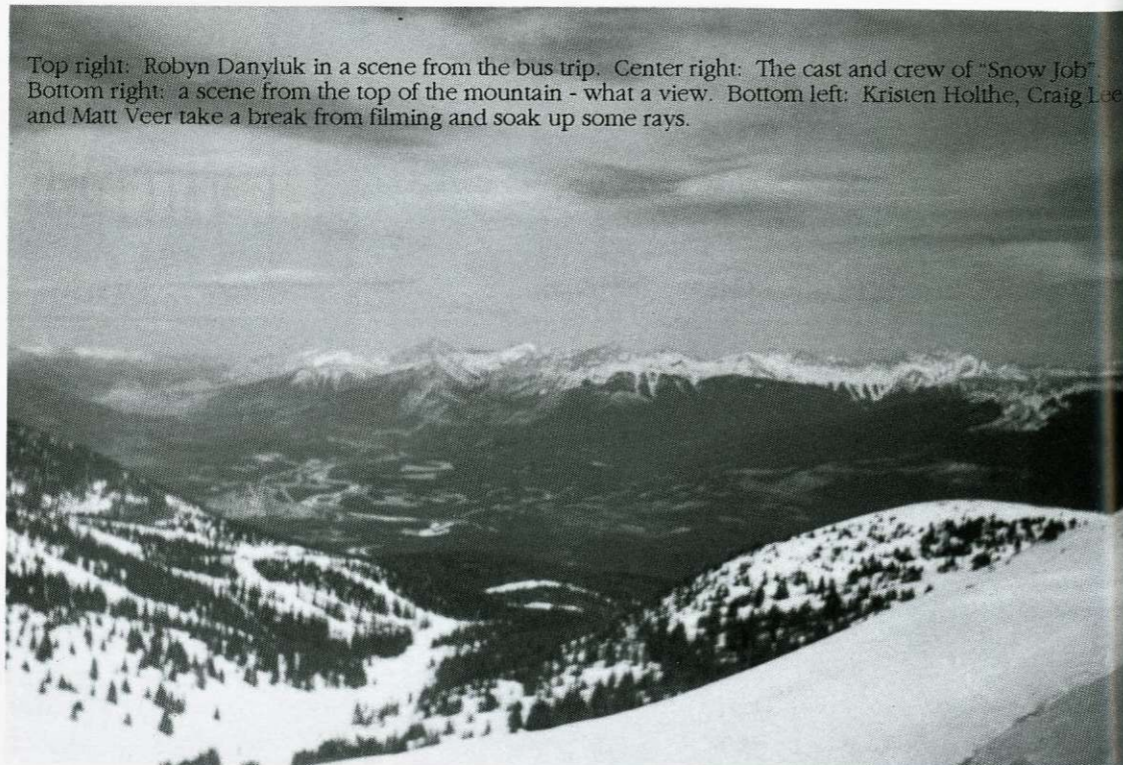
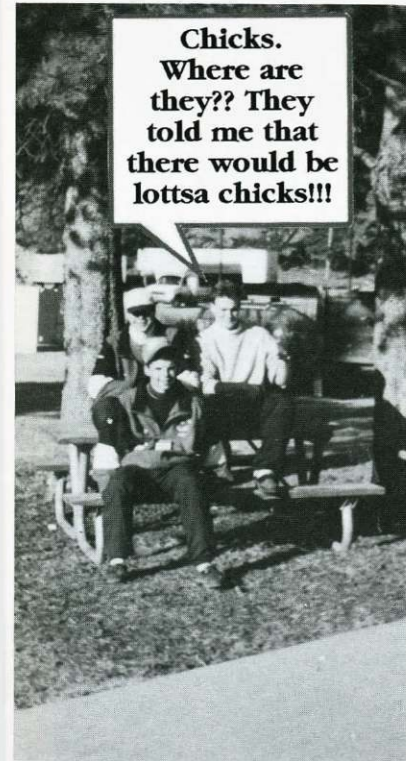


Stay in School Tour

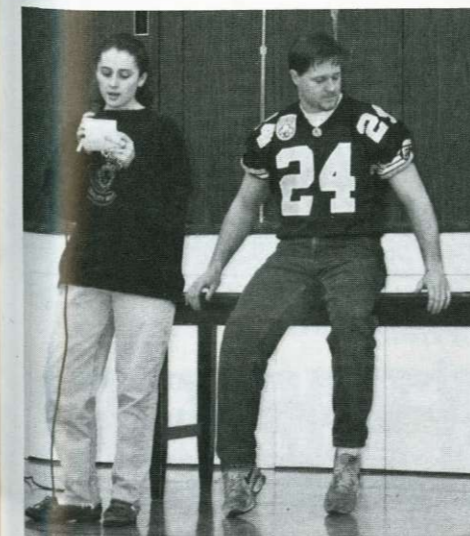

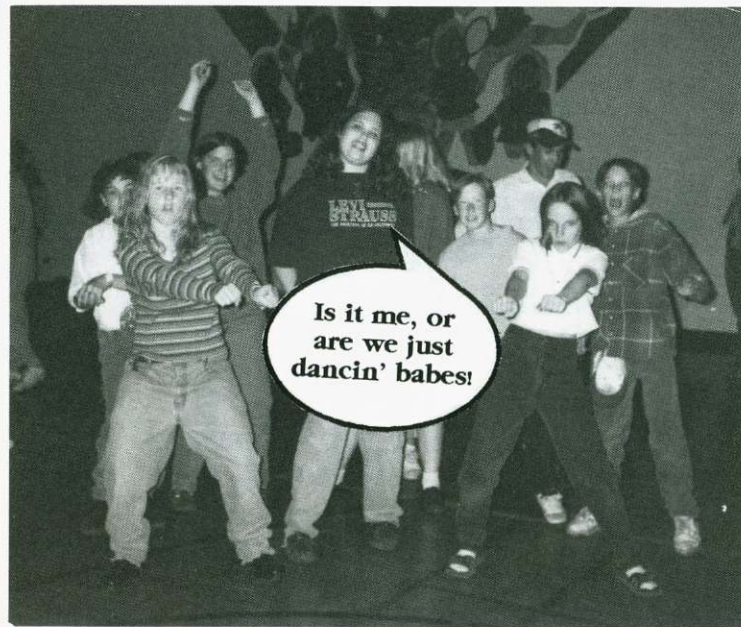

When I first came here I thought it was going to be boring. But after the first hour in your school, I realize that it was great.

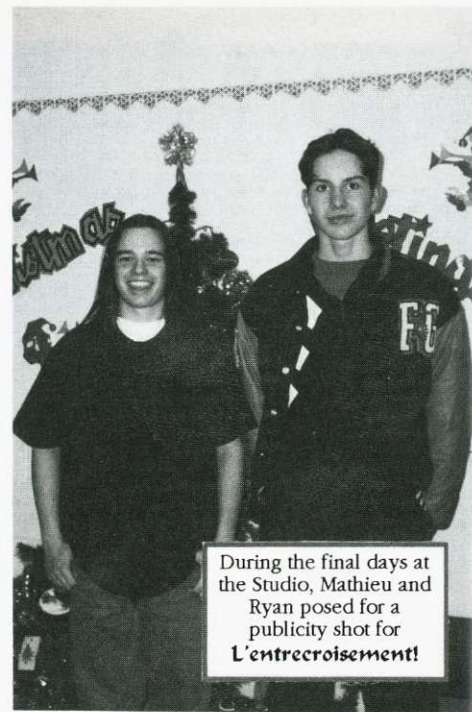

From the Executive Director's Chair

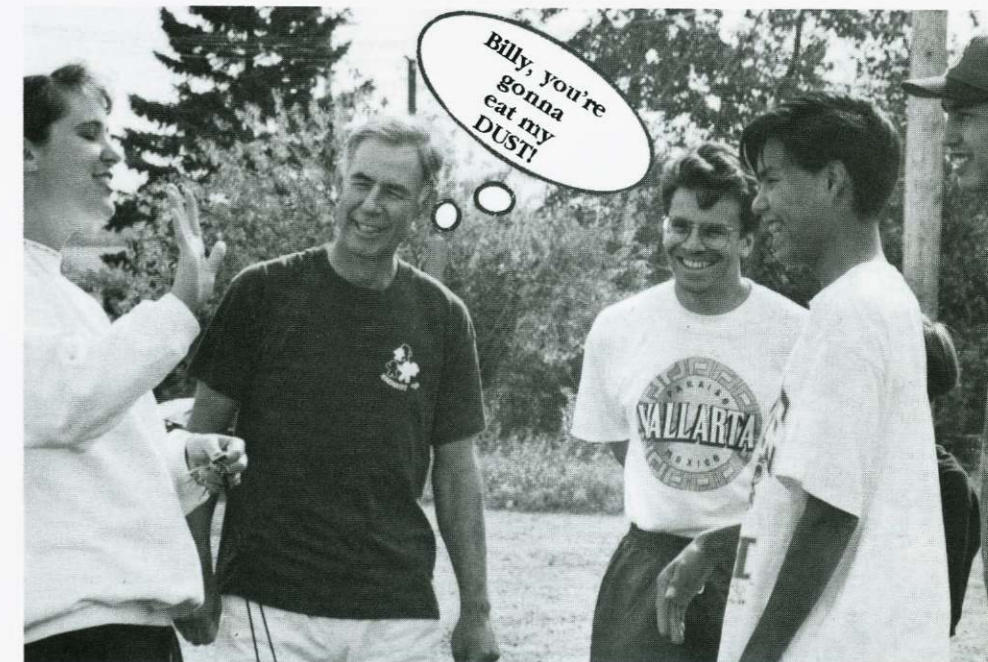

These include original ideas, as evidenced in the photography, graphics, artwork, design and written content, as well as unique solutions to the problems presented in creating a yearbook.

BASIC INFORMATION & ORGANIZATION

- 4 1. Yearbook contains basic *identifying* information:
 - Cover and title page, in combination, includes the theme, year, school, full school address (street, city, province, postal code), telephone number (optional), volume number (optional).
 - Spine if present includes the school, year, title or theme, and volume number (optional).
- 2 2. Book has a clear *introduction*:
 - Includes a *Table of Contents* with good placement and design. *Missing*
 - has *introductory stories* (Example: story explaining theme or history of school or principals message etc.)
- 3 3. Book organization is clear and information follows a *logical format*. Divider pages that are in some way consistent are employed to easily identify sections. *Employ dividers. Your book is a bit hard to follow.*
- 5 4. Book employs an easily identifiable *theme* that is informative and imaginative and is carried throughout. Cover, endsheets, opening, divider pages, headings, and closing are compatible and enhance the theme. *Outstanding theme development*
- 4 5. The layout and design feels *unified and harmonious* and employs elements that create a general feeling of consistency throughout the publication.
- 3 6. *Layouts within sections* are arranged in an easy to follow, logical manner. *366-69 feel out of place. Ads throughout tend to clutter.*
- 4 7. *Closing page* is effective and reinforces the theme and an *index* is included. *No index*
- 5 8. The *audience* of the book is taken into consideration and the general "look" appeals to the reader. The book does not look bland. *Outstanding!*
- 5 9. Pages are *numbered*. *Excellent theme tie-in*

GENERAL LAYOUT & DESIGN

- 3 1. Layouts have consistent and sufficient *external and gutter margins* and important visual matter is not lost in the gutter. *Gutter is pretty tight especially at the beginning*
- 5 2. *Internal margins* between photos, captions, headline and copy are consistent and balance the pages.
- 1 3. Pages are *uncluttered* and white space is used effectively. Book does not use "every available inch" at the expense of readability. *Why too cluttered.*
- 2 4. Layouts have a strong *center of interest* (photo, drawing or typographical element) usually created through size. Viewer is able to find a focus. *Employ a dominant photo on DPS's*
- 4 5. *Color* (if used) is effective, and color backgrounds used in conjunction with color photographs are not so vivid they fight for attention. *Backgrounds are varied (eg. black, grey).*
- 5 6. *Graphics and artwork* employed, whether original or clip art, enhance the layout and are of a high quality. They are consistent and relevant to the overall theme of the book or the individual theme of the page. *Terrific use of graphics*
- 4 7. Design elements do not *bleed* off the edge, unless deliberately placed to enhance the design.
- 2 8. Designs are based on *double page spreads* and are balanced. *Have some predominant elements, margins etc line up on all DPS's*
- 5 9. Type is *high quality* and standard type-writer and poorly crafted hand-done lettering is avoided.
- 5 10. All type fonts selected are *legible* (readable).
- 5 11. Different fonts selected are kept to a minimum unless effective use is made of varied typestyles. Typefaces selected enhance the design and contribute to a sense of unity.
- 1 12. *Point size* of headings, subheadings, captions and stories are consistent throughout the book (unless a distinctive typographical treatment is being used to enhance the design). *Keep point size of stories consistent with each other*

PHOTOGRAPHY

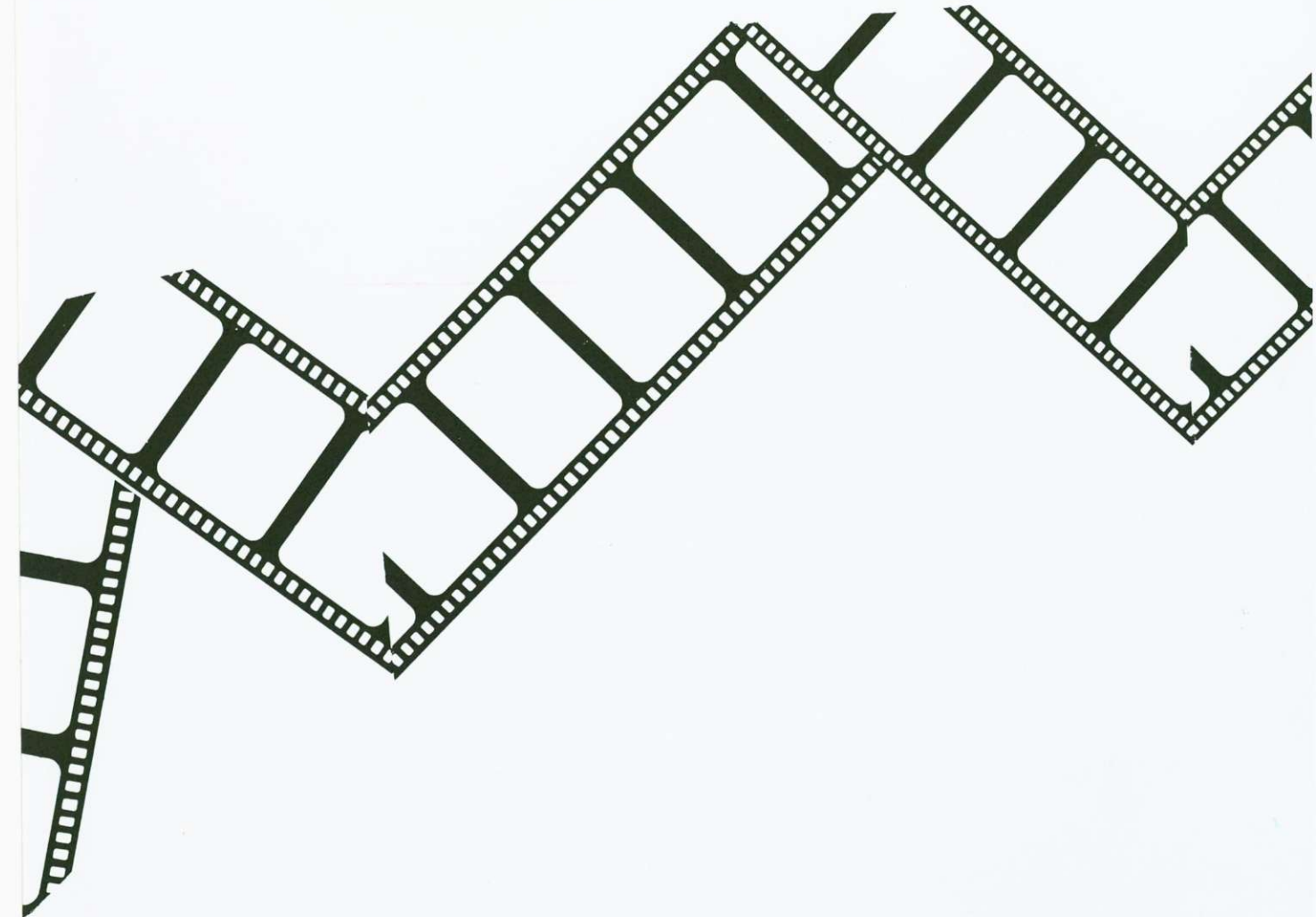
- 4 1. Photographs are *sharp* with *strong contrast*.
- 3 2. Photographs have *good composition*, each with an obvious center of interest that obeys the rule of thirds. In addition, they are balanced and unified, with uncomplicated backgrounds, generally achieved by moving in close.
- 4 3. Photographs are *cropped* for effective composition. Messy cut-outs and many-sided unevenly shaped photographs are avoided. (Circles, triangles, diamonds, squares, evenly shaped many-sided photographs can often work well if they are arranged to enhance the layout).
- 4 4. Faces in candid and action photos *face toward the gutter* rather than toward the edge of the page, to avoid leading the viewers attention out of the format.
- 4 5. Candid photos look *natural*, rather than posed.
- 5 6. Student *portrait pages* are consistent, easy to follow and harmonious. *Very creative!*
- 3 7. Both *interior* and *exterior shots* of the school are included.

WRITTEN CONTENT

- 5 1. *Headlines* are clear and distinctive.
- 5 2. The written content, particularly *headlines* relate to and carry the theme. *Outstanding*
- 5 3. *Stories* and other body copy are interesting and well written, with correct grammar, spelling and punctuation. Stories are written in third person, past tense.
- 5 4. *Stories* and other body copy cover the five main areas of interest within the school.
- 4 5. *Captions* accompany the majority of photos and are placed in a non-confusing manner.
- 3 6. *Captions* have good lead-ins, are present tense, descriptive and identify people by their first and last name.
- 5 7. The majority of *photographic spreads* are accompanied by *stories* or other written matter.
- 5 8. The book contains a "reasonable" minimum of *typographic errors*.
