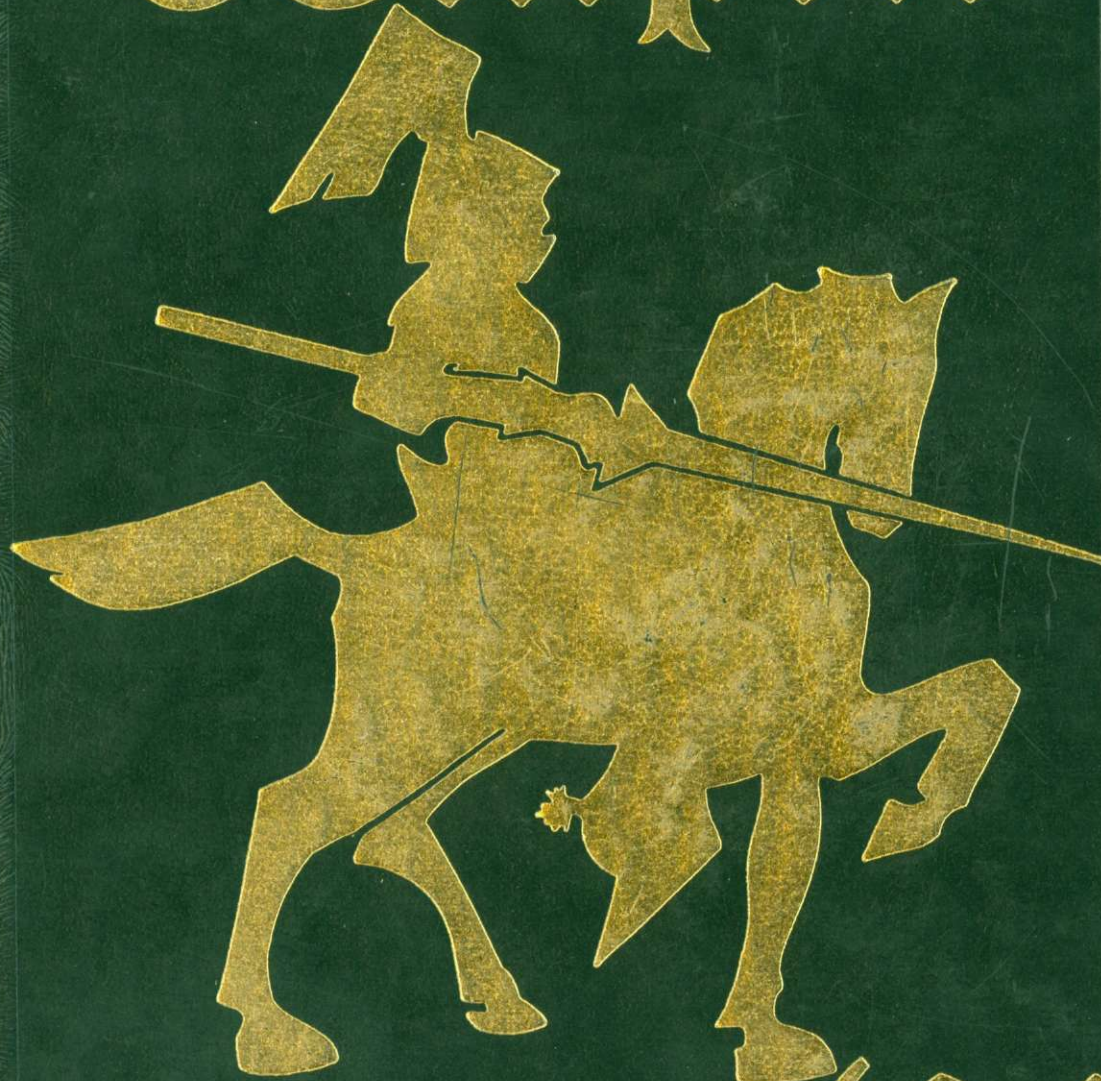

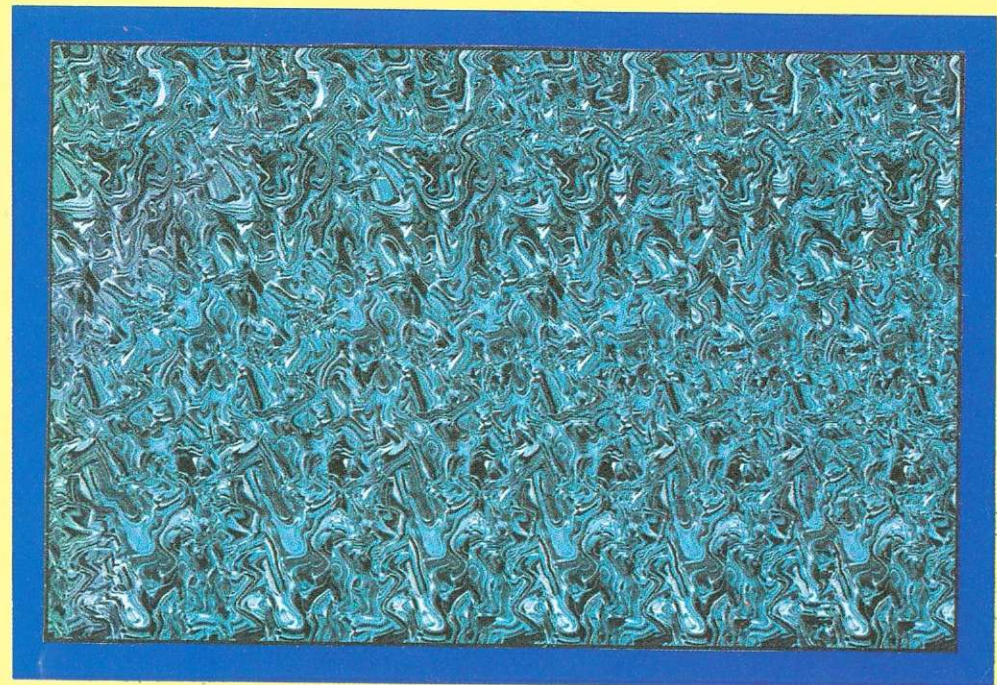

Our Castle

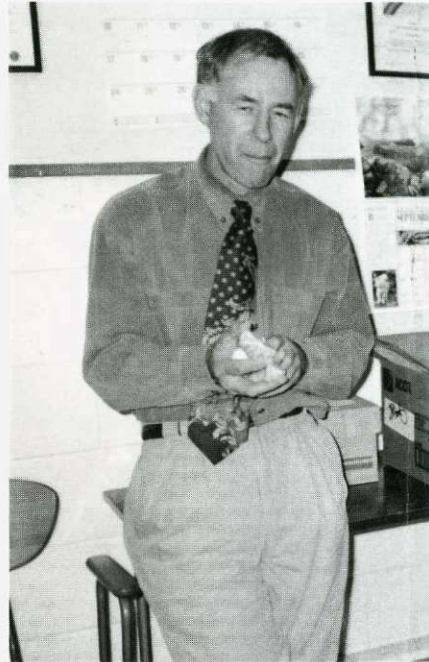

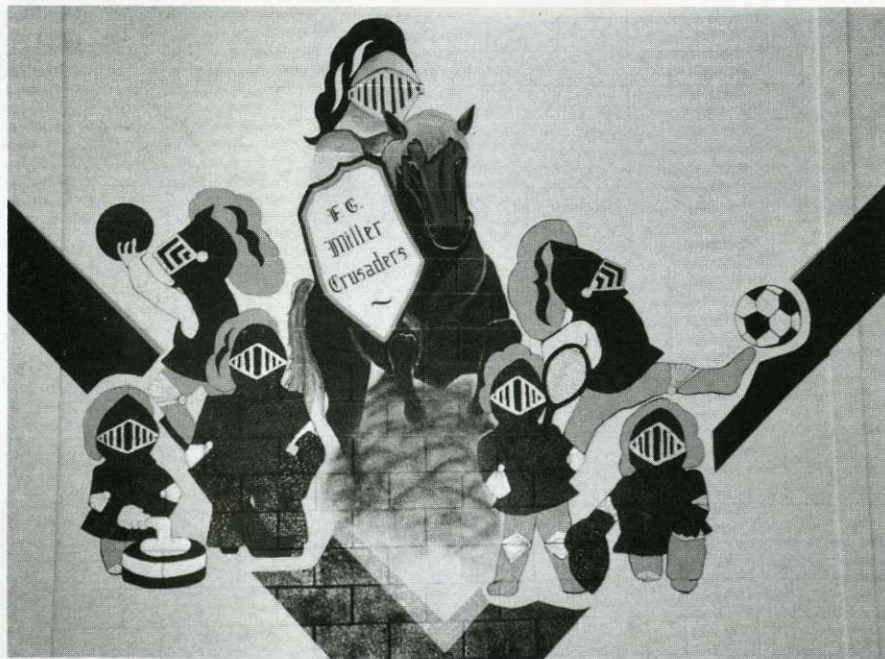
The 1995/96 Wapiti and the memories that it will bring you will help to give a strong sense of history as you journey into the future.

Within the castle dwell a group of knights called the Crusaders. The Crusaders are a merry lot.

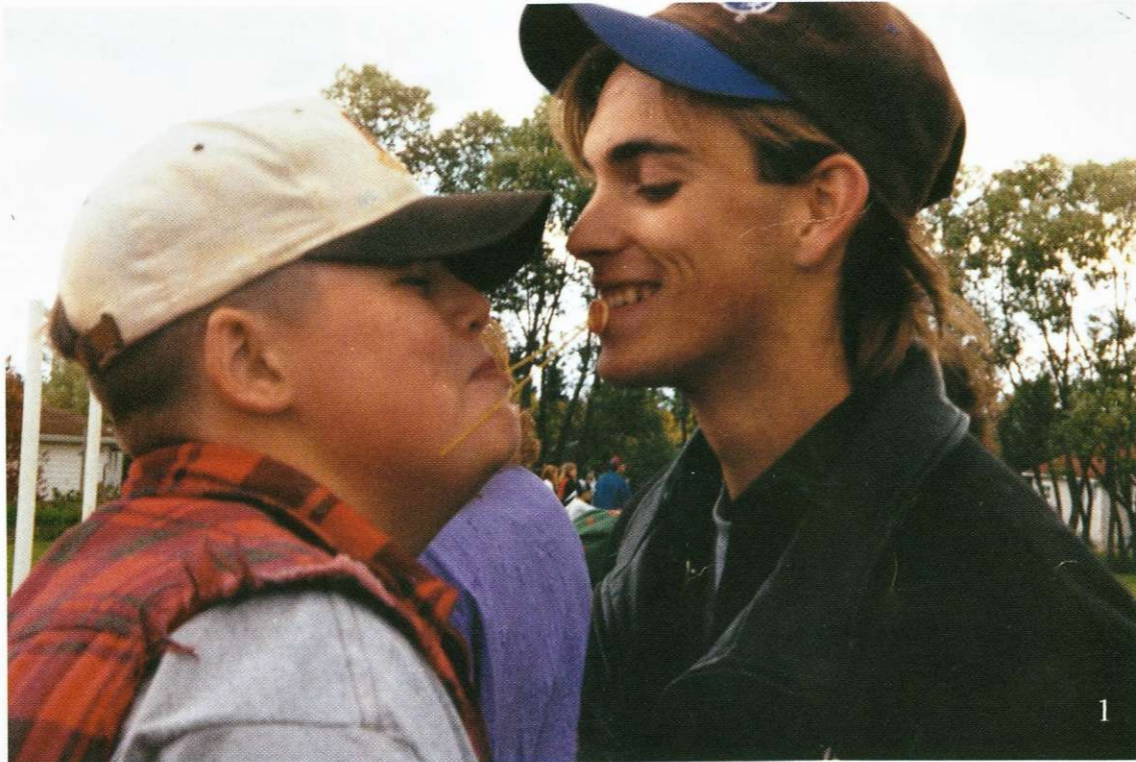
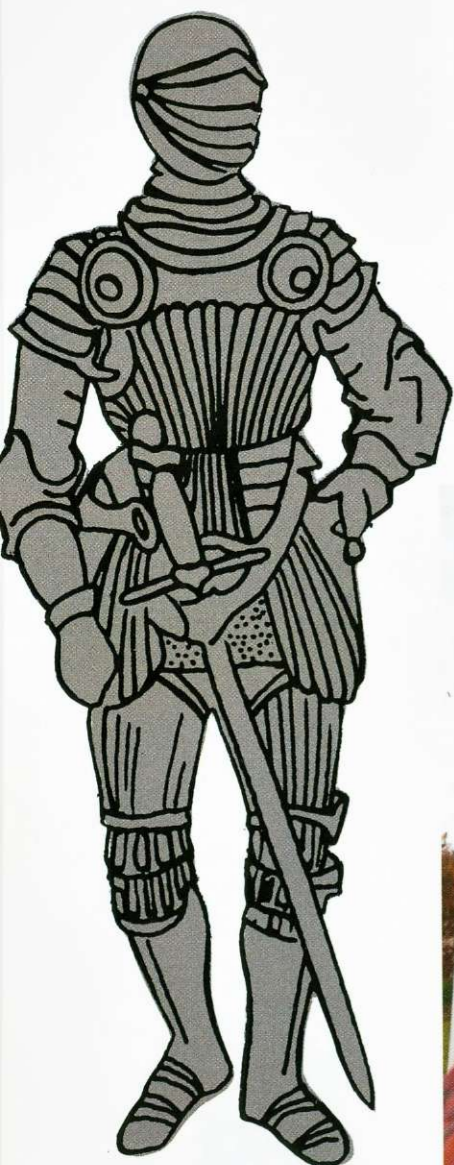


Our “castle” is named after Frederick Gustave Miller. He was a doctor who moved to Elk Point and practiced medicine for 52 years. Dr. Miller was an active member of the school boards and was Elk Point’s representative on the St. Paul School Division. He played an integral part in the building of the school and was concerned with the quality of education of the students in the area. In 1961, this school was opened and dedicated to Dr. F. G. Miller. Dr. Miller left us with a legacy of continuing education.

All Hallow's Eve

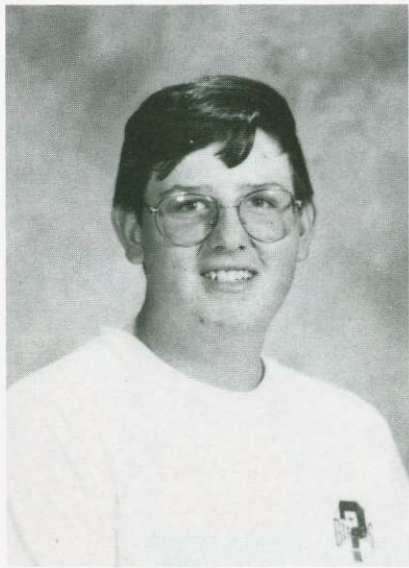

You can never bring it back.

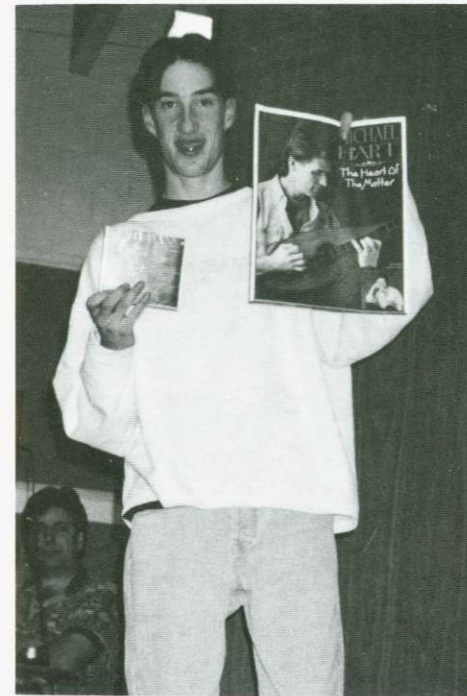

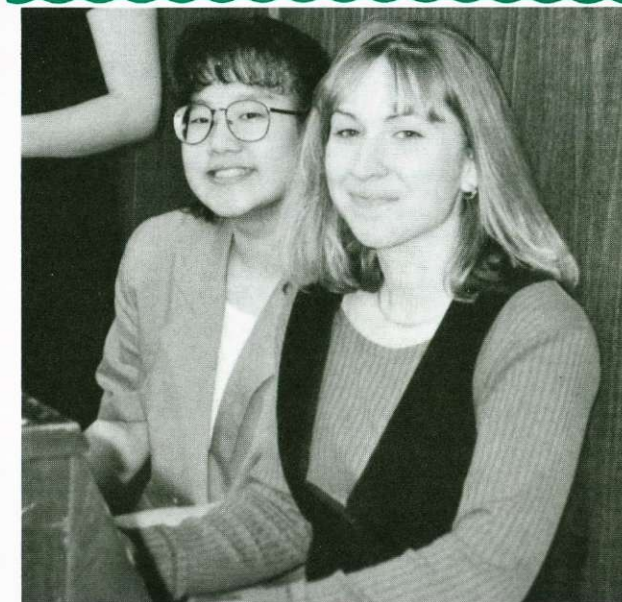
Talent Show

Senior's Tea

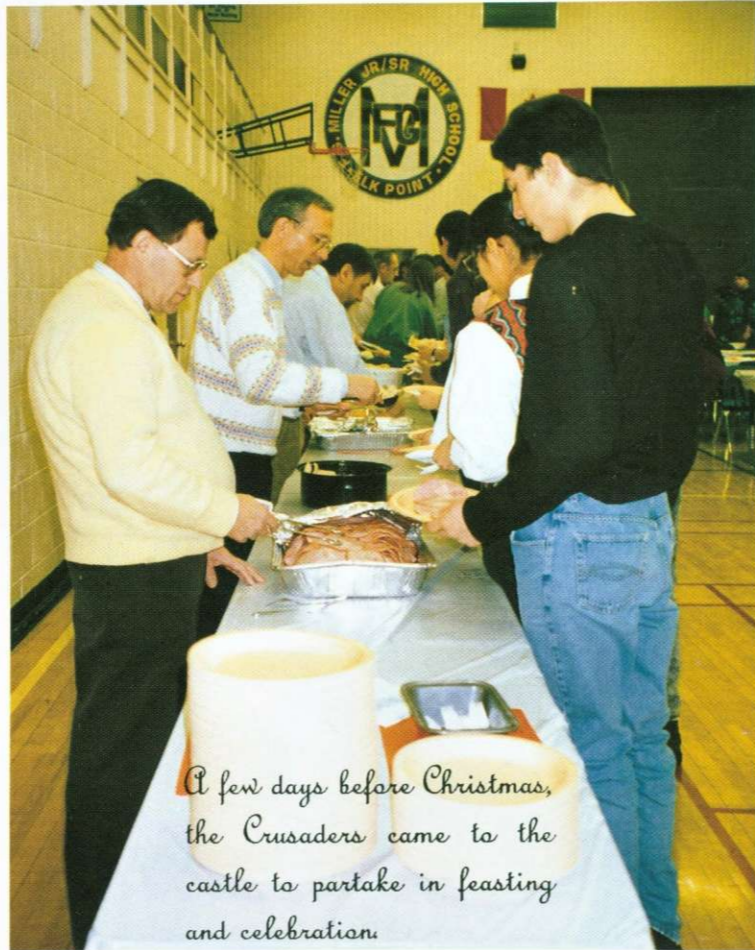

On June 29, F. G. Miller Castle held its first commencement ceremonies. Fifteen kings and queens were honored during the ceremonies and royal banquet.

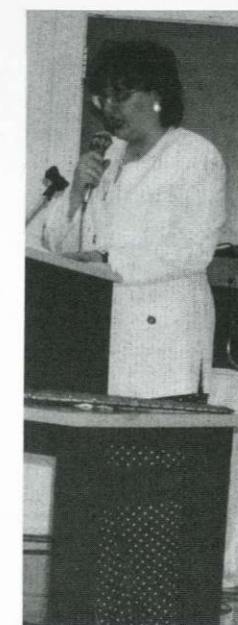

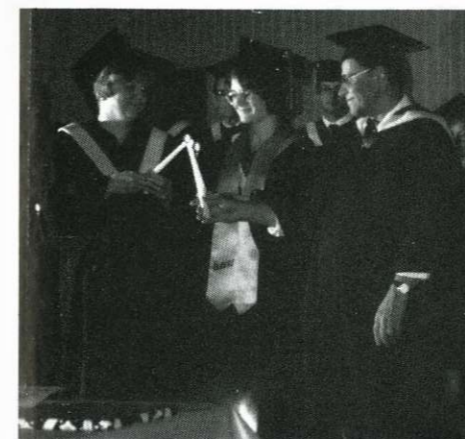
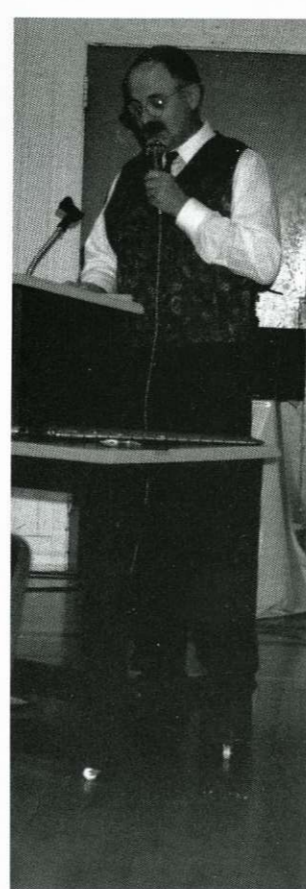

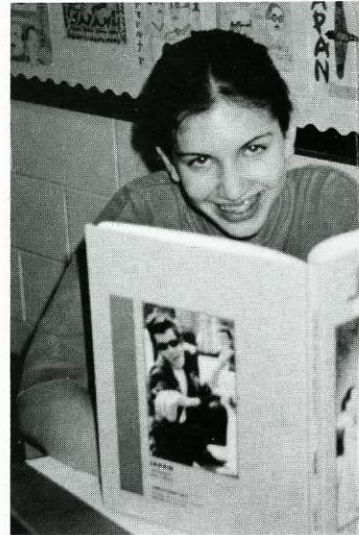

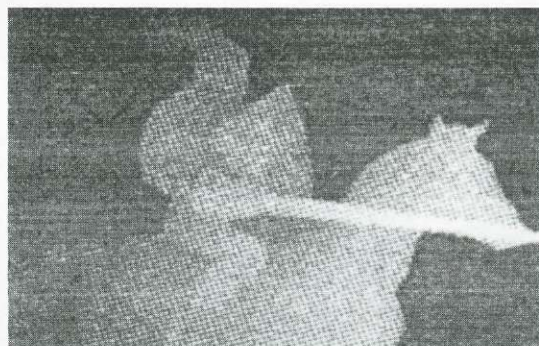
