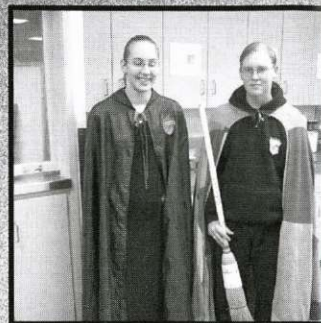
The Greatest Gift of All -- Life!

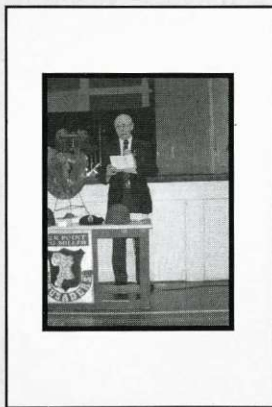
John Braga told of an uncle who lied about his age just so he could enlist in WW II, and of another who was the only survivor when a plane was shot down.

Stephen Kozina described how his gido came to Canada from Poland via the Russian army and the Allied forces.

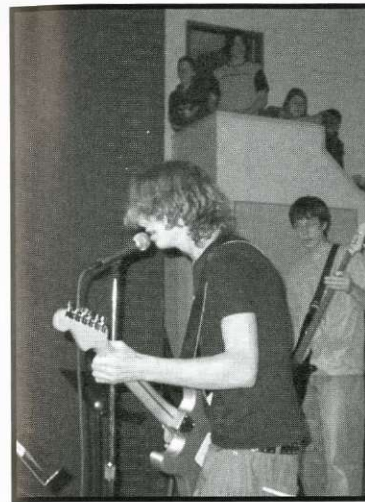
There was a candlelight presentation during the 2 minutes of silence, and the ceremony ended with veterans' speeches and the pinning on of poppies.

The Christmas Spirit!

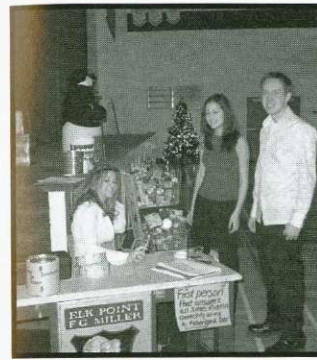

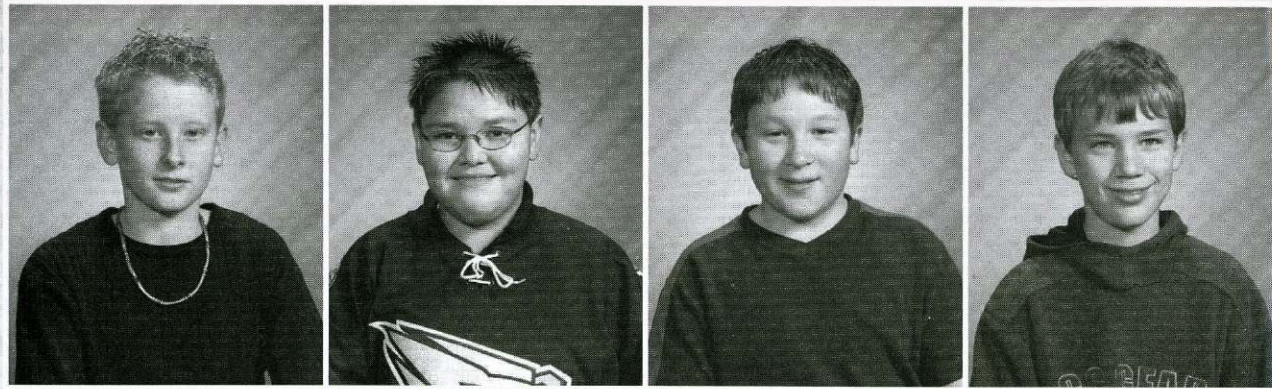

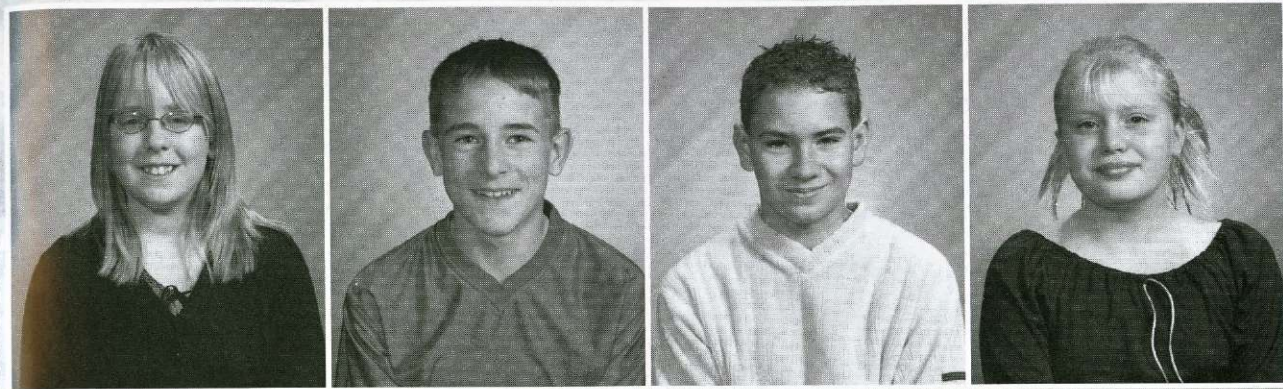
Leapin' Lords! Milk maids and dancing girls cavorted across the stage in "The Twelve Days of Christmas" as presented by FG Miller Staff.

Beating the Cold...

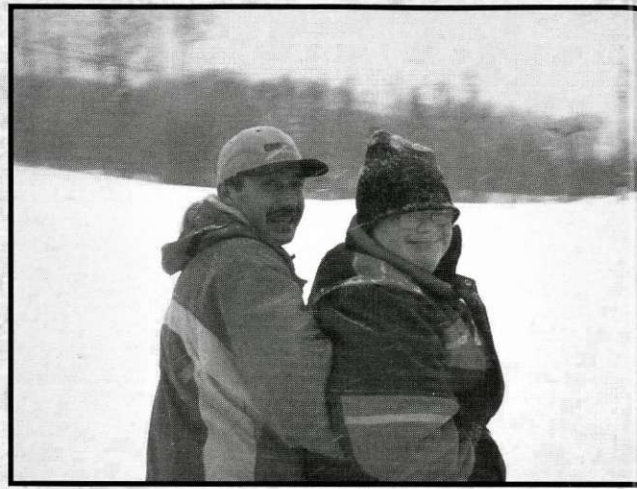

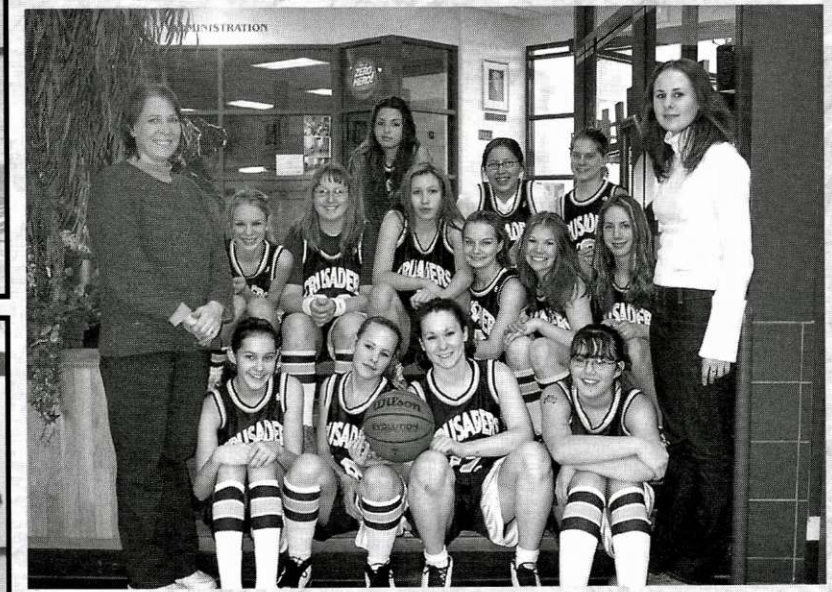


Beating the Odds...



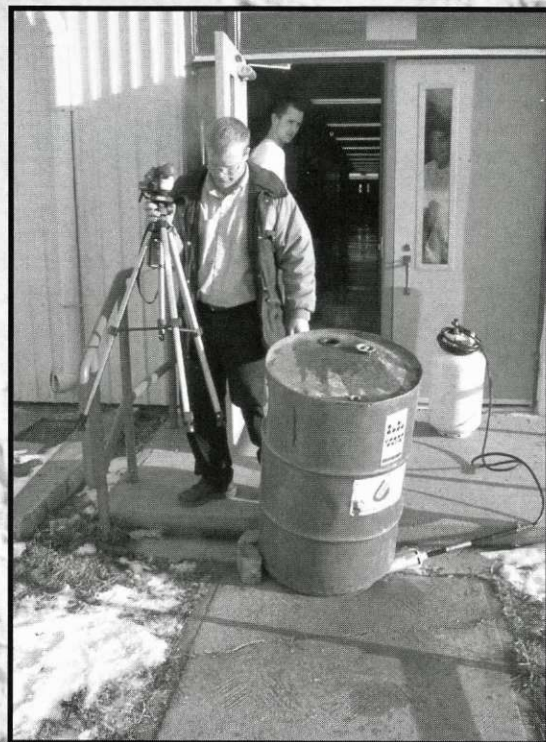

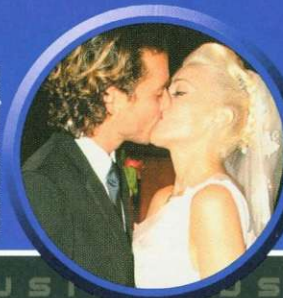

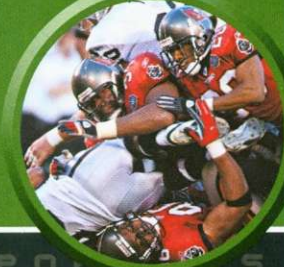
